

Motherhood is a journey marked by the Art of Guidance. Like many of you, I spend today in gratitude for being mothered well. My mother Carmel Rita taught me valuable lessons and gave me a foundation for emotional security. The most valuable currency my mom taught our family was "Time". Time well spent together was and continues to be her superpower given to her children. My Mother taught me about empathy, kindness, and compassion. Even today her love continues to help me develop a sense of security and self-worth. My mother's embrace lets me know with absolute certainty, that I am loved regardless of anything I could do. At times, even when we disagree her love is still there, unwavering, filling the space of time and inviting me back home. My mother showed and taught me the "more" of God. She taught me to find God in many images, not just gendered ones. She taught me that anything good can be used to communicate God's goodness to me.

God is a shepherd, a warrior, a king, a servant, a midwife, a homeless woman, an artist, a rock, the light, the fire, and God is in those who mother us into life. For all the men and woman who sought out the mother they needed to remind them they are beautiful and lovable I am humbled by your resilience. And for all those who became that mother for someone in need the world is grateful. My Mom taught me that Mothers are everywhere, if we only have the eyes to see them. And as an adult I recognize that Motherhood is woven into the very fabric of creation, and God says that all of creation talks about Her glory. I relate to God as Mother not so much because of my role as a stepmother to five adult children, but because in parenting I have found just how much I still need to be mothered. I pray today for all those who have lost their mom or a mother figure or aunt who consoled them. The fact is, none of us can carry grief by our own strength.

I have been reminded in my life how often I experience God's presence primarily through the women who care for and console me. In their love and compassion, I see the tender maternal face of God. It reminds me that I, as a woman, bear the image and likeness of God. It is not in spite of my female body and soul that I am like God, but because of it. I believe that nothing is more important to God than meeting our present need for closeness. Our God is ready to embrace us at every turn. The book of Hosea shares that God will always bring Her people back to Herself. In Hosea, I call to mind the Eucharist, Jesus' humble way of "bending down" and feeding us with His very body. As a rule, I gravitate to the Gospel of John because I need the daily reminder that we are born of Love, so that we might Love in the world. We can't have one without the other. John wants us to know that Jesus is God's gift of love to us. God's love is sacrificial. God is willing to give up everything so that we might once again experience oneness with God and with one another. We love, God says, because God first loved us.

When I think of all the women and men who have mothered me well, I am astounded by their courage and their tenacity for selflessness. And here is where the rubber meets the road. We live in a world that capitalizes on our fears. Politicians regularly point out why we should be afraid. Fear doesn't necessarily indicate a lack of faith. Sometimes, it signifies a lack of feeling safe. Now, there may be reasons why we should be cautious in life, but I wonder about the notion that when fear takes hold - Love can disappear. Fear divides us from one another. It makes us cynical. The message here, then, is this: if we embrace and trust the God who is love it allows us to work on saying "no" to fear. At these platforms of safety, we feel strong enough to build bridges with those who are hurting and standing on the margins of society. It allows us to share and experience of reconciliation with our God. And, since this is Mother's Day, a day when we remember and honor the love of those who mother, perhaps we can best celebrate today by being fed by the Love of our great God. A love that transforms our lives and helps us to overcome our fears.

Important Information:

- First Communion typically takes place when a child is in 2nd grade. OSP requires one year of Religious Education PRIOR to registering for First Communion. If that has not been met, please sign your child up for 1st grade.
- Reconciliation typically takes place in 3rd grade.
- Confirmation is a two year process. The preparation begins in Fall of 7th grade and Confirmation will take place in the Spring of their 8th-grade year.

PLEASE NOTE: In sacramental years (2nd, 3rd and 7th) of Partners, the cost for one child is \$400 (\$325 plus a \$75 sacramental fee. The fee for Foundations is \$400 (\$325 plus a \$75 Foundations Fee). For all other grades, the fee is \$325.) If you are registering more than one child, please use the discount code "additionalchild" for the 2nd, 3rd or 4th child. Once that code is entered, the amount for each child will be \$150 or \$225 if in a sacramental year.

Azimah received her GED after four years of study. She is now taking classes in college prep to attend college and be an accountant. She and her family were refugees from Myanmar







Maria, from Venezuela, from day 1 she has been very industrious and now takes ESL classes.




OSP Book Club is meeting Sunday May 19 from 10:30 am to noon in the third floor library of the 711 Building.

The Northside Book Club's May meeting is on Monday, May 20. We will be reading "Sin in the Second City" by Karen Abbott.







Saint Leopold Mandic

Saint of the Day for May 12, 2024

Western Christians who are working for greater dialogue with Orthodox Christians may be reaping the fruits of Father Leopold's prayers.

A native of Croatia, Leopold joined the Capuchin Franciscans and was ordained several years later in spite of several health problems. He could not speak loudly enough to preach publicly. For many years he also suffered from severe arthritis, poor eyesight, and a stomach ailment.

For several years Leopold taught patrology, the study of the Church Fathers, to the clerics of his province, but he is best known for his work in the confessional, where he sometimes spent 13-15 hours a day. Several bishops sought out his spiritual advice.

Leopold's dream was to go to the Orthodox Christians and work for the reunion of Roman Catholicism and Orthodoxy. His health never permitted it. Leopold often renewed his vow to go to the Eastern Christians; the cause of unity was constantly in his prayers.

At a time when Pope Pius XII said that the greatest sin of our time is "to have lost all sense of sin," Leopold had a profound sense of sin and an even firmer sense of God's grace awaiting human cooperation.

Leopold, who lived most of his life in Padua, died on July 30, 1942, and was canonized in 1982. In the Roman liturgy his feast is celebrated on July 30.

Saint Francis advised his followers to "pursue what they must desire above all things, to have the Spirit of the Lord and His holy manner of working" (Rule of 1223, Chapter 10)—words that Leopold lived out. When the Capuchin minister general wrote his friars on the occasion of Leopold's beatification, he said that this friar's life showed "the priority of that which is essential."




