

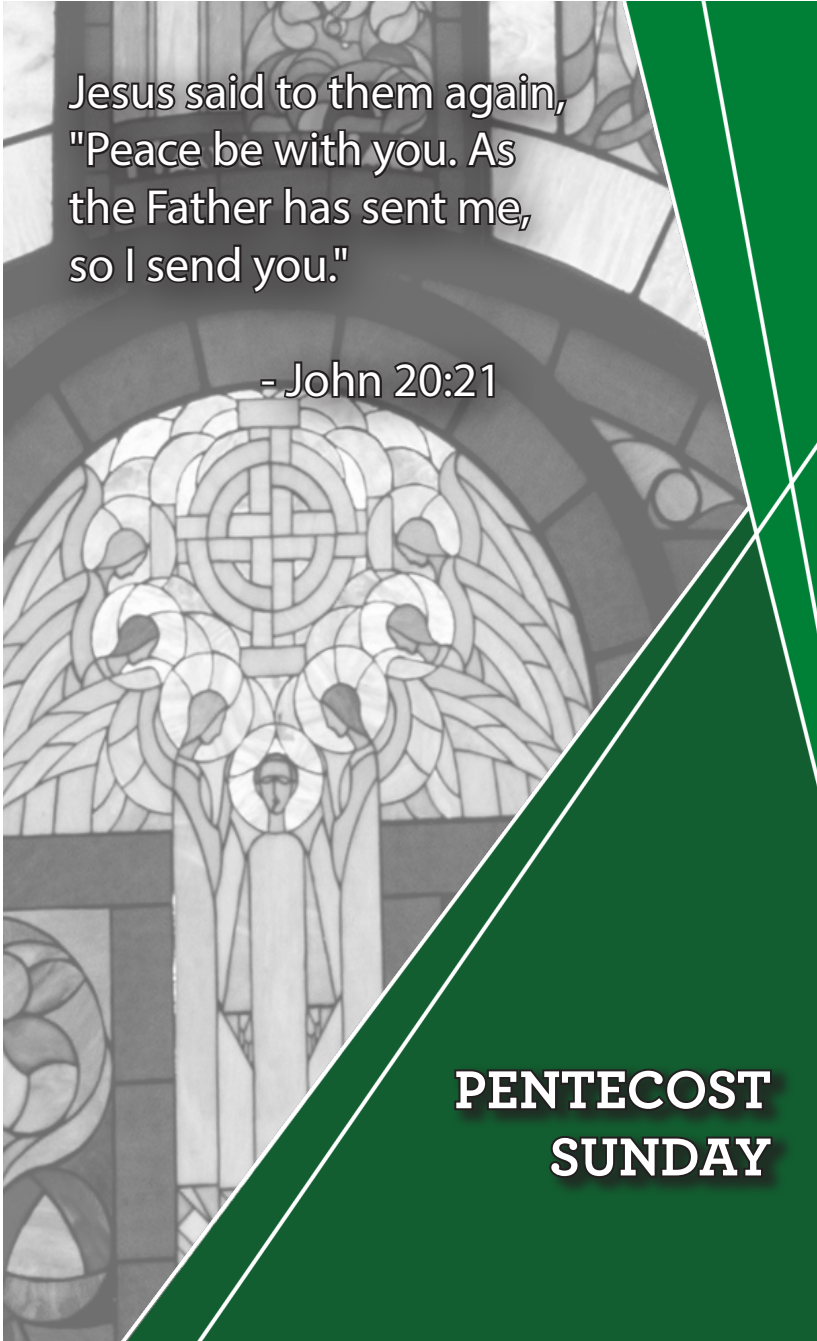

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends,

As I shared in an email with our community on Tuesday, the Illinois Attorney General has released a report which is the culmination of a multi-year review of the Illinois Catholic dioceses' response to the child sexual abuse crisis. The release of this report resurfaces great pain and reopens wounds for those who have been harmed by priests and other representatives of the Church. As a priest and pastor, I offer my sincere apology to victim-survivors. All of us feel great shame and sympathy as we are reminded of the betrayal of trust and the harm that has been done to the people of God.

For many years now, the archdiocese has been committed to extensive measures to create a safe and healthy environment for our church. Policies and protocols have been implemented that impact everything from the formation of priests to the ways our schools and parishes operate. I encourage you to read the resources of these efforts summarized in the information available on our website provided by the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth. The need to be vigilant and unrelenting in our efforts is clear.

Today is Pentecost and we celebrate the liberating, empowering and healing rush of the Holy Spirit into the church in those first days after the resurrection of Jesus. Receiving the Spirit released our ancestors in the faith from the fear that held them back from the mission. Let's pray together that the same Spirit might fill our hearts and empower us to do the work of healing and reconciliation and to become the Church we are called to be.

There's a growing movement in this country toward reducing the size of lawns. More and more people are recognizing that lawns look green, but are not contributing to the health of our world. Lawns in the US consume 9 million gallons of water per year, up to 60% of total home water usage in dry places. Our lawnmowers burn 200 million gallons of gas per year, while emitting noise loud enough to cause hearing loss. One hour of mowing a lawn emits the same amount of carbon dioxide as a 100-mile car trip. We spend between 7 and 48 days each year mowing our lawns, time when we could take part in other outdoor activities. We spread 78 million pounds of pesticides and fertilizers on lawns; these chemicals pollute our streams when they run off our lawns.

Lawns provide almost no habitat and no food for pollinators and other insects. Birds may eat berries contaminated with pesticides, with dire consequences. So, what are your options if you want to reduce the size of your less than green lawn?

- 1) You can replace your lawn with an herb and/or vegetable garden, if you have a sunny or partially sunny space. Most vegetables and herbs need about 6 hours of sun per day. By growing your own food, you can save money at the supermarket, enjoy the freshest possible food, and eat organically if you choose. If your harvest is bountiful, you can build community by sharing with your neighbors.
- 2) You can turn parts of your lawn into a native plant garden. There are native plants that are adapted to all our local conditions, from shade to full sun, and from dry to pond's edge. The National Wildlife Foundation has a Native Plant Finder, which uses your zip code to identify natives that will thrive where you live. Wild Ones is a national organization with local chapters, devoted to helping homeowners grow native trees, shrubs, grasses, and wildflowers, through chapter meetings and plant sales. With these resources, you can connect to other gardeners, and learn about local sources for native plants.

Start with your lawn! Let this be one of the steps you take toward sustainability and care for our common home.

What visual images come to mind with today's Pentecost readings? Among the most memorable are the Holy Spirit descending on the Apostles in the form of flame and fire, plus their receiving the "gift of tongues". Are these images still relevant today? The answer to this question is a resounding yes.

Pentecost transformed the fear-filled Apostles, hiding in a locked room, into people of action. They then went to many new lands to spread the message of Jesus. This same message of love for all and hope for a better world is needed today. We may lack the "gift of tongues" given to the disciples, but our own "gifts" to immigrants, refugees and asylum seekers can "speak" loudly about our ongoing commitment to Jesus' call to love our neighbors as ourselves. Accompaniment and love can be expressed in many ways, one of which involves supporting the Immigrant and Refugee Ministry at Old St. Pats. We greatly appreciate your continued support and prayers.

At many liturgies we sing "We Are Many Parts" by Marty Haugen. It is an especially relevant song for Pentecost. It lyrically speaks to the immigrant and refugee experience. Consider these words from the refrain:

We are many parts, We are all one body,
and the gifts we have, we are given to share.
May the Spirit of Love make us one in deed.

This is a song calling us to act!

Mr. Haugen does not say "May the Spirit of Love make us one indeed" but "one in deed" or rather one in action.

"We are all one body, the body of Christ." Let's turn these words into positive actions of love and hope for our sisters and brothers, who are also immigrants and refugees. May the Spirit of Love make us one in deed. Indeed!

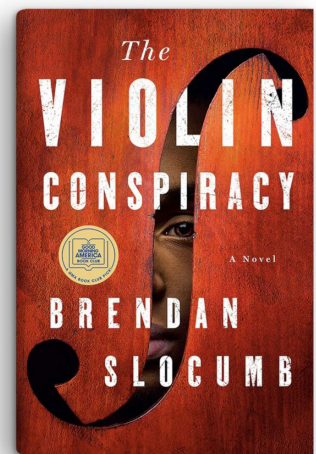

PARTNERS RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (K-8th Grade)

It's been said that it takes a village to raise a child. Here at Old St. Patrick's we believe it takes a community to help us on the journey to "find" God.

With this in mind, the Partners Program was created to form a connection with parents to bring religious education to the children in our community.



Celebrate Family

The Partners Program offers thematic classes for children in preschool through Confirmation that enriches their understanding of God, the Church, sacraments, religious holidays, and values. The teachers use stories from Sacred Scriptures and religious textbooks in the classes. Parents are expected to participate in workshops on the first Sunday of each month to help develop the monthly theme at home and foster the partnership.

Classes are held twice a month on Sunday mornings from 10:15 to 11:30 in the Frances Xavier Warde School classrooms from September through April. Registration for Partners Religious Education is now open and closes before the first class takes place in September 2023.

Important Information:

- First Communion typically takes place when a child is in 2nd grade. OSP requires one year of Religious Education PRIOR to registering for First Communion.
- Reconciliation typically takes place in 3rd grade.
- Confirmation is a two year process which begins in 7th grade.

They are also a ton of fun and are a great way to bond with other Foundations teens.

Worktour: Foundations teens have the opportunity to take part in a weeklong service trip that teens can participate in each summer to help out an area of the country in need whilst also learning about issues of social justice on their yearly "Worktour." For example, Foundations teens that have attended Worktour have provided disaster relief in Oklahoma and New Orleans; discussed Civil Rights in Birmingham, Alabama; explored immigration near the border in Texas, and examined the education system in Washington, D.C.

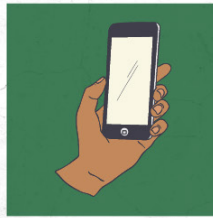

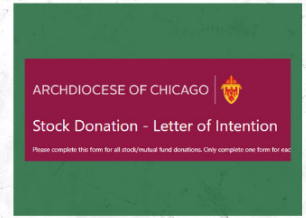

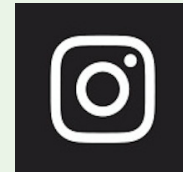

Venerable Pierre Toussaint Saint of the Day for May 28, 2023

Born in modern-day Haiti and brought to New York City as a slave, Pierre died a free man, a renowned hairdresser, and one of New York City's most well-known Catholics.

Plantation owner Pierre Bérard made Toussaint a house slave and allowed his grandmother to teach her grandson how to read and write. In his early 20s, Pierre, his younger sister, his aunt, and two other house slaves accompanied their master's son to New York City because of political unrest at home. Apprenticed to a local hairdresser, Pierre learned the trade quickly and eventually worked very successfully in the homes of rich women in New York City.

When his master died, Pierre was determined to support himself, his master's widow, and the other house slaves. He was freed shortly before the widow's death in 1807.

Four years later, he married Marie Rose Juliette, whose freedom he had purchased. They later adopted Euphémie, his orphaned niece. Both preceded Pierre in death. He attended daily Mass at St. Peter's Church on Barclay Street, the same parish that Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton had attended.

Pierre donated to various charities, generously assisting blacks and whites in need. He and his wife opened their home to orphans and educated them. The couple also nursed abandoned people who were suffering from yellow fever. Urged to retire and enjoy the wealth he had accumulated, Pierre responded, "I have enough for myself, but if I stop working I have not enough for others."

Pierre originally was buried outside St. Patrick's Old Cathedral, where he was once refused entrance because of his race. His sanctity and the popular devotion to him caused his body to be moved to the present location of St. Patrick's Cathedral on Fifth Avenue.

Pierre Toussaint was declared Venerable in 1996.

Pierre was internally free long before he was legally free. Refusing to become bitter, he daily chose to cooperate with God's grace, eventually becoming a compelling sign of God's wildly generous love.
