

THE RETURN OF THE COMMON CUP

On this Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, we celebrate and honor the presence of Christ in all forms—especially as we gather through our Eucharistic celebration. We are overjoyed to announce that the Archdiocese of Chicago has lifted the last remaining COVID restrictions and has permitted the Common Cup - the Blood of Christ - to be distributed again at Masses. Indeed, the fullest sign of the Eucharistic Banquet is to eat *and* drink.

Beginning **July 9th** we will once again offer the Blessed Sacrament under *both* species - bread and wine. There will be more information shared as we get closer to July 9th about the logistics of the Cup returning to Mass. In the meantime, we are grateful for your support, presence, and understanding during the time of the pandemic and looking forward to this return.

"It's one thing hearing about this immigration crisis in the news. It's another thing altogether to meet a family in crisis who is alone and scared. I want to demonstrate to my third grader what God's love in action looks like and let her know that her paying attention to the needs of others in our community made a difference in this family's life."

In early May when Saige, an FXW third grader, was dropped off at school, she noticed a family in the park across the street and was concerned that they might be homeless. They were a young couple with a baby--and it was raining. She asked her dad to check on them, which he did. They were the Valdivieso family, who had just arrived on a bus from Texas, originally from Venezuela, and they didn't speak any English.

After getting them something to eat, some clothes and supplies for the baby and themselves, a call to 311 advised that the family should be dropped off at a police station. However, because of the influx, families were spending days there before they get placed at shelters, which are full.

The Abrahams family called around to a number of local organizations with no luck. They found temporary housing for the young Valdivieso family on their own and with their own support plus the generous financial help of some other FXW families, and their own church, the Progressive Baptist Church, have been able to support the family to date, including finding an immigration attorney for them. They were very moved by this young family's story of walking and taking any type of moving vehicle through eight countries over an eight-month period to get from Venezuela to the Texas border—and how they were willing to risk everything to give their baby, Christopher, a future with opportunities that he would never have in Venezuela.

An OSP parishioner, Kerry Brown Hasbrook, eventually put them in touch with OSP's Immigrant & Refugee Ministry (IRM). Our chair, Maureen Hellwig, connected them with Catholic Charities, which has approved "All Kids" health care coverage for Christopher, the Link card applications, and other programs available to them.

IRM is presently seeking permanent housing for the Valdivieso family and hopes to help with finding a job as well. Thanks to the very generous support of our OSP parishioners, we have supplies from our household collection earlier this year—new sheets, towels, comforters, dinnerware, pots/pans, etc.—everything they will need to live comfortably. Once the apartment search is finalized, we will be able to provide furniture and new beds, utilizing our partner, the Chicago Furniture Bank. A team of IRM family liaisons have already been put in place: Giovana Quigley, Mary Ann McNiece, Peggy Burke and Sr. Jane Zimmerman, who will guide the family through many of the necessary steps to acclimate them to living here—using the transit system, ESL classes, grocery shopping, etc.

IRM will accompany this asylum-seeking or refugee family and provide personal assistance and support to the family, i.e., finding a job, registering children for school, etc. The apartment will ideally be located near public transportation and be approximately \$1,500 monthly. Renting to this family will be an important element in launching them successfully.

WELLNESS CORNER

Getting Back to Normal

Getting back to normal post pandemic was something we all dreamed about for 2+ years. Many of us are excited to once again, be gathering and socializing. But for some, the FOMO (fear of missing out) experienced during the pandemic has been replaced with FONO (fear of normal). This can range from a continued concerns of getting sick to being stressed about how to resume socialization.

It's important to realize living through the pandemic was a traumatic event we collectively experienced. Below are some helpful tips for those who are feeling some post pandemic anxiety. Every one of us was impacted by the global pandemic so remember you are not alone in this.

RECOGNIZE AND ADDRESS YOUR MENTAL HEALTH CHALLENGES For many, a return to "normal" might mean addressing mental health challenges that intensified or arose during the pandemic. Nearly half of the Americans surveyed in a large NIH study said they suffered from anxiety or depression during the pandemic. Alcohol-induced deaths increased by 38%. Drug overdose death rates rose by 50% and 50% of young adults (ages 18-24) reported anxiety and depression symptoms in 2023. If you have a therapist, continue to talk about how you are doing. If you have recently developed stress and/or find yourself facing new mental health challenges, reach out to your support network and/or seek professional help.

OBSERVE AND ACCEPT HOW YOU FEEL When you are stressed, fearful, or uncomfortable, pause to think about what you are feeling and consider what is activating those feelings. Focus on ways to prepare for what comes next.

GO AT YOUR OWN PACE Make decisions that feel right for you. Start with being honest with yourself about limits, and don't feel bad if you're not ready to resume activities at your pre-pandemic pace. Many folks are reevaluating their priorities and how they choose to spend their time.

BE DIRECT ABOUT WHAT WORKS FOR YOU Try being direct when discussing plans with friends and family. Using "I" statements helps make it clear you are making decisions based on your personal needs. Being upfront can also put others at ease.

EXERCISE Moving your body is one of the best stress-reducing activities. Making time to walk or run outside, bike, dance, or practice yoga might be just what you need to find calm. Daily exercise naturally produces stress-relieving hormones and improves overall physical health.

WATCH WHAT YOU EAT AND DRINK Eating well and staying hydrated helps stabilize our mood. Limit your consumption of highly processed foods and use of alcohol and recreational drugs as a means to unwind; they don't actually reduce stress and often worsen it.

GET ENOUGH SLEEP Our bodies and minds need rest to function properly.

SPEND TIME IN NATURE Time in nature reduces stress. Something as simple as tending to a garden or house plants or walking through a park can help calm you.

PRACTICE MINDFULNESS When you're stressed, the idea of meditating might seem impossible, but we know it can work. Start slow with breathing in a peaceful location, or sitting outside with a cup of tea (without scrolling through your phone!). Prayer, deep breathing, meditation, and mindful practices can train our brain to better manage stress. Consider apps such as Calm, Insight Timer, Headspace, or 10 Percent Happier.

FIND SUPPORT You don't have to suffer alone. Reach out to your network for support, whether it's a friend, family member, a licensed therapist, church community, or a support group. It's true that we are stronger together and opening up to talk about what we're feeling and thinking can help. If you live with a mental health condition or have a family member with a mental health condition, consider meeting with a licensed therapist to help you create an action plan.


On Saturday, June 17th from 9AM -5PM in 625 W. Adams, we will have a summer retreat for young adults led by young Jesuits.



Saint Barnabas

Saint of the Day for June 11, 2023

Barnabas, a Jew of Cyprus, comes as close as anyone outside the Twelve to being a full-fledged apostle. He was closely associated with Saint Paul—he introduced Paul to Peter and the other apostles—and served as a kind of mediator between the former persecutor and the still suspicious Jewish Christians.

When a Christian community developed at Antioch, Barnabas was sent as the official representative of the church of Jerusalem to incorporate them into the fold. He and Paul instructed in Antioch for a year, after which they took relief contributions to Jerusalem.

Later Paul and Barnabas, now clearly seen as charismatic leaders, were sent by Antioch officials to preach to the gentiles. Enormous success crowned their efforts. After a miracle at Lystra, the people wanted to offer sacrifice to them as gods—Barnabas being Zeus, and Paul, Hermes—but the two said, "We are of the same nature as you, human beings. We proclaim to you good news that you should turn from these idols to the living God" (see Acts 14:8-18).

But all was not peaceful. They were expelled from one town, they had to go to Jerusalem to clear up the ever-recurring controversy about circumcision, and even the best of friends can have differences. When Paul wanted to revisit the places they had evangelized, Barnabas wanted to take along his cousin John Mark, author of the Gospel, but Paul insisted that since Mark had deserted them once, he was not fit to take along now. The disagreement that followed was so sharp that Barnabas and Paul separated: Barnabas taking Mark to Cyprus, Paul taking Silas to Syria. Later they were reconciled—Paul, Barnabas and Mark.

When Paul stood up to Peter for not eating with gentiles for fear of his Jewish friends, we learn that "even Barnabas was carried away by their hypocrisy" (see Galatians 2:1-13).

Barnabas is spoken of simply as one who dedicated his life to the Lord. He was a man "filled with the Holy Spirit and faith. Thereby, large numbers were added to the Lord." Even when he and Paul were expelled from Antioch in Pisidia—modernday Turkey—they were "filled with joy and the Holy Spirit."

Saint Barnabas is the Patron Saint of Cyprus.


