



"Being Christian is not first of all a doctrine or a moral ideal; it is a living relationship with him, with the risen Lord: we look at him, we touch him, we are nourished by him and, transformed by his love, we look at, touch and nourish others as brothers and sisters." Pope Francis

Saints, poets, mystics, and even popes have given voice to this central truth of our Chirstian faith. In Jesus, we experience God incarnate. If we want to know what God is like, if we wonder what God's orientation to us and the world might be, watch Jesus. In what he says and does, he invites us into a relationship. The response he desires from us is not simply a cognitive assent to an idea about God but a wholehearted leap into friendship with him. The stunning, liberating and thrilling truth that sits at the heart of our faith is that through Jesus Christ we have been invited into the very life of God. We have been drawn into the community of love we name Father, Son and Spirit.

Often at baptisms I will read from Matthew's account of the baptism of Jesus. He tells us that, "after Jesus was baptized, he came up from the water and behold, the heavens were opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming upon him. And a voice came from the heavens, saying 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." Think about those words. At this key moment in the life and ministry of Jesus, the voice of God speaks not some complicated theological pronouncement or riddle. The voice does not enumerate a few new laws to be followed. Instead, what we hear are tender words of affection. "This is my Son. He pleases me so!" The Beloved hears those words and must have been deeply consoled by them. I suspect that the deep consolation of that love inspired him onward into the mission that would unfold in the days that followed the baptism at the Jordan.

Today's gospel is a second time that Matthew testifies to the love that unites Jesus and the one who sent him. From the cloud on the Mount of Transfiguration, we hear, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." To Peter, James and John and to all of us, the divine voice invites us to listen to Jesus and enter more deeply into the conversation of friendship. As we celebrate this feast of transfiguration, revelation and friendship with God, I hope that we might all experience anew, the tender affection of our God who says those words to us. "You are my beloved child!" May we know the grace to respond generously to the invitation to deepening friendship with God who loves us beyond our power to imagine. May we, as Pope Francis says, look at Jesus, touch him...be transformed by his love and then look at, touch and nourish each other as brothers and sisters.

Welcome back, Parliament of the World's Religions

Wednesday, July 19, 2023

With great joy, I welcome the thousands of people representing more than 80 nations who will gather in Chicago Aug. 13-18 for the Parliament of the World's Religions. My first experience with the parliament came when I traveled to Toronto to deliver a plenary address at the 2018 convening. There I saw firsthand the diversity and vitality found at this largest worldwide gathering dedicated to cultivating harmony among the world's religious and spiritual communities.

This year's theme, "A Call to Conscience: Defending Freedom and Human Rights," urges participants defend the freedom and human rights of all, especially those most in need. Rooted in the diverse beliefs and practices found among the world's religious traditions and spiritual communities, attendees will explore ways to bring about a more just, peaceful and sustainable world. Knowing it is vital that the Catholic Church remain involved in these principled conversations for the good of our community and world, I welcome the opportunity to take part in these discussions as part of a plenary session at the invitation of the parliament leadership.

In his 2020 encyclical, "Fratelli tutti," Pope Francis teaches that "the different religions, based on their respect for each human person as a creature called to be a child of God, contribute significantly to building fraternity and defending justice in society. Dialogue between the followers of different religions does not take place simply for the sake of diplomacy, consideration, or tolerance. In the words of the Bishops of India, 'The goal of dialogue is to establish friendship, peace and harmony, and to share spiritual and moral values and experiences in a spirit of truth and love" (271).

The upcoming convening of the parliament is an opportunity to live out the Holy Father's teaching that a core part of our identity as Catholics involves building friendship between members of different religious traditions. Through our sharing of spiritual and ethical values, we get to know one another. This understanding equips us to address together the social and moral challenges we face in an increasingly secularized world.

The "instrumentum laboris" (working document) for the synod gathering in Rome this October builds on this sentiment when it states that "a synodal church is called to practice the culture of encounter and dialogue with believers of other religions and with cultures and societies in which it is embedded, but above all among the many differences that run through the church itself" (25). Through encountering members of many distinct religious and spiritual communities at the parliament, Catholic participants can better understand and experience the synodal way of dialogue across differences, whether cultural, social or religious.

Moreover, local Catholics will encounter Catholics from Africa, Asia, Europe, Oceania and South America, allowing them to experience firsthand the rich diversity that makes up the global Catholic communion. The parliament is a unique opportunity for Catholics in Chicago to take part in Pope Francis' call to grow into a more synodal church.


Headquartered in Chicago, the parliament has long partnered with the archdiocese to support the goals of interreligious dialogue, and the archdiocese will be well represented at the parliament. Please consider visiting the archdiocesan booth in the exhibit hall, as well as the "Catholic room" dedicated to hospitality for Catholic attendees and anyone else who may want to stop by for conversation or a moment of quiet reflection.

A special on-site Mass is being organized for the Feast of the Assumption on Aug. 15. On Aug. 17, local Christian leaders will gather to jointly sign a declaration affirming our call to care for our planet. Expert theologians, spiritual leaders, artists and practitioners from the Catholic Church and each of the faith traditions found at the parliament will lead hundreds of presentations, workshops, art exhibits, musical performances and films, offering fresh insights and educational opportunities.

For these reasons and many more, I invite you to consider attending the Parliament of the World's Religions as it returns to its birthplace in Chicago. Participating will help you grow in understanding the values and practices that guide members of other religious traditions, while giving you a much broader and deeper understanding of the worldwide Catholic Church. Perhaps most important, it will offer you an opportunity to grow in your own faith and understanding as you share with others what it means to be a Catholic Christian disciple in a changing and remarkably diverse world.




Transfiguration is clearly the theme this week, but it is about more than Christ. Every person is beloved in the eyes of God and we all can encounter Christ transfigured. Where? Everywhere, when we open our eyes to see the glory of everyone on earth and let our hearts embrace God within them.

Today marks the anniversary of the death of Pope Paul VI. He had a deep, clear understanding of the church's transfiguring role in the world. In his encyclical, Populorum Progressio (On the Development of People), he strongly identifies with the hopes and struggles of the poor and oppressed. His words are striking in their clarity and bluntness. "The Fathers of the Church laid down the duties of the rich towards the poor in no uncertain terms. As St. Ambrose put it: 'You are not making a gift of what is yours to the poor man, but you are giving him back what is his. You have been appropriating things that are meant to be for the common use of everyone. The earth belongs to everyone, not to the rich.... No one may appropriate surplus goods solely for his own private use when others lack the basic necessities of life." WOW!!! That is a radical, transformative viewpoint. Can we understand it and embrace it, or even live it?

Working with and accompanying the migrants and asylum seekers in Chicago can be our own "transfiguration" event. It has the ability to transform both their lives and ours. Please help the Old St. Pat's Immigrant & Refugee Ministry in any way that you are able. Who knows how these experiences may impact your life? It is often said that God moves in mysterious ways. Could this opportunity provide your own, personal metamorphosis?

Stepping Up To The Plate

A friend introduced us to OSP's livestream masses during COVID. OSP's liturgies, programs and particularly their community outreach efforts touched us deeply. The Kinship Initiative was particularly "calling our names" as we live in Peoria, IL and our south side is, like North Lawndale, one of the most impoverished neighborhoods in the state. We wanted to experience this Kinship Initiative and learn from it. Now we come to Chicago as often as we can to be a part of the OSP community!

THE NORTH LAWNDALE EMPLOYMENT NETWORK MISSION

As you may know, the North Lawndale neighborhood used to be a much larger, thriving community. Major employers left some years ago, and the unemployment rate skyrocketed along with crime and poverty. We arrived at OSP as the North Lawndale Employment Network (NLEN) was opening doors to its brand new campus to make a difference in the lives of residents desiring work to better their lives. We have had the privilege of meeting some of the very talented and committed people who work at NLEN. Their focus is to remove the barriers that make it difficult for so many to find work: transportation, a permanent address, a current driver's license, a phone, soft skills, proper dress, interview skills, addiction, previous incarceration, childcare, education or further training. Each individual has unique skills and unique needs, and the NLEN staff meets each one where they are to remove the barriers that most affect him/her. We hope you have read their stories in previous OSP Crossroads Bulletins.

NLEN SUCCESS STORIES



Tyshena Cage, an NLEN client, received housing assistance from North Lawndale Works after she lost her apartment in a fire. Ty is now studying cosmetology. Van Williams, another NLEN client, remained in his housing and retained his job thanks to the assistance he received from North Lawndale Works to pay down his back rent and overdue utility bills.

These are real people, good people who have been given that "hand-up" by NLEN rather than simply a "handout." As you can imagine, there is a cost to removing those barriers, and that is where NLEN and we, at OSP, come in. Learn more about NLEN at: <u>www.NLEN.org</u>



RAISING FUNDS TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE

North Lawndale Works, one of many programs of the North Lawndale Kinship Initiative, began a fund three years ago to give NLEN a way to provide for special needs in removing those barriers for NLEN clients. Through the generosity of Old St. Pat's members, close to \$40,000 was raised and several NLEN clients received the assistance they needed to progress. However, those funds have now been depleted and we are hoping that you'll open your hearts and wallets to help replenish them. Because NLEN has doubled its client base since the close of the pandemic, the North Lawndale Works Team hopes to also double the fund in proportion to NLEN's client growth. You'll find brochures in church that explain what certain donation amounts will fund for a job seeker.

The efforts of NLEN are important to us at Old St. Pat's for many reasons. We strongly believe that our world will be a better place if we follow the 7 Themes of Catholic Social Teaching, which are:

- (1) Life and Dignity of the Human Person,
- (2.) Call to Family, Community and Participation,
- (3.) Rights and Responsibilities,
- (4.) Option for the Poor and Vulnerable,
- (5.) Dignity of Work, and Rights of Workers,
- (6.) Solidarity, and
- (7.) Care for God's Creation.

All are addressed when we help those who come to NLEN in search of work opportunities. Pope Paul VI said, "If you want peace, work for justice." Matthew 25: 31-46 lets us know of Jesus' command that what we do for the least of those among us, we are doing for Him. We ask that you please join with us in supporting North Lawndale Works, an important part of OSP's North Lawndale Kinship Initiative.



PARTNERS REGISTRATION (KINDERGARTEN TO 8TH GRADE) CLOSES ON AUGUST 15, 2023.

The Partners Program offers thematic classes for children in preschool through Confirmation that enriches their understanding of God, the Church, sacraments, religious holidays, and values. The teachers use stories from Sacred Scriptures and religious textbooks in the classes.



Parents are expected to participate in workshops on the first Sunday of each month to help develop the monthly theme at home and foster the partnership. Classes are held twice a month on Sunday mornings from 10:15 to 11:30 in the Frances Xavier Warde School classrooms from September through April.

- First Communion typically takes place when a child is in 2nd grade.
 OSP requires one year of Religious Education PRIOR to registering for First Communion.
- Reconciliation typically takes place in 3rd grade.
- Confirmation is a two year process which begins in 7th grade.







Saint Eusebius of Vercelli

Saint of the Day for August 2, 2023

Someone has said that if there had been no Arian heresy denying Christ's divinity, it would be very difficult to write the lives of many early saints. Eusebius is another of the defenders of the Church during one of its most trying periods.

Born on the isle of Sardinia, he became a member of the Roman clergy, and is the first recorded bishop of Vercelli in Piedmont in northwest Italy. Eusebius was also the first to link the monastic life with that of the clergy, establishing a community of his diocesan clergy on the principle that the best way to sanctify his people was to have them see a clergy formed in solid virtue and living in community.

He was sent by Pope Liberius to persuade the emperor to call a council to settle Catholic-Arian troubles. When it was called at Milan, Eusebius went reluctantly, sensing that the Arian block would have its way, although the Catholics were more numerous. He refused to go along with the condemnation of Saint Athanasius: instead, he laid the Nicene Creed on the table and insisted that all sign it before taking up any other matter. The emperor put pressure on him, but Eusebius insisted on Athanasius' innocence and reminded the emperor that secular force should not be used to influence Church decisions. At first the emperor threatened to kill him, but later sent him into exile in Palestine. There the Arians dragged him through the streets and shut him up in a little room, releasing him only after his four-day hunger strike. They resumed their harassment shortly after.

His exile continued in Asia Minor and Egypt, until the new emperor permitted him to be welcomed back to his see in Vercelli. Eusebius attended the Council of Alexandria with Athanasius and approved the leniency shown to bishops who had wavered. He also worked with Saint Hilary of Poitiers against the Arians.

Eusebius died peacefully in his own diocese at what was then considered an advanced age.




