



I am all too aware these days of the pain of suffering and loss. It seems that on a daily basis I hear of another person in my life struggling with sickness or the reality of death.

Many of you reading this know that I experienced the journey from life to new life with my father this past Spring. It was a road traveled that was both painful and beautiful. Friend, colleague, and mentor, Fr. Ed Foley, sent me a note when my Dad was passing saying that "parenting our parents into their final journey is a terrible beauty." And how true that was.

Amidst the pain of loss and the grief of letting go, there were significant moments of beauty. Moments filled with hope and incarnate love. From the one-on-one moments I shared with my Dad to say goodbye, to the steady stream of family and friends coming to the house to be with my father, to the food (so much food!) that was lovingly prepared for the family, there was such spiritual and physical fortification and beauty in this theophany—a physical manifestation, or incarnation, of God and Christ in our midst.

We hear in today's readings about several theophanic occurrences. From Elijah hearing the voice of God through a whisper in the midst of chaos, to Paul embracing that Christ is the Son of God who is above all and in all, to Jesus's imperative to his disciples "it is I; do not be afraid." God is with us, in our midst. In the good times and in the bad, the times when storms arise, and the times we need to hear that gentle voice whispering in our ear that all will be okay.

In the midst of the storms of life it is easy to lose sight of our connection to the Divine. For how could God let this happen? Where is the Divine in the natural disaster that claims thousands of lives? Where is the Divine in a devastating cancer diagnosis? Where is the Divine in the news of another friend entering their final journey of life?

While these are all challenging questions to answer, I think the answer is very simple. The Divine is in and around you always. In your thoughts, actions, and love. Like it was for Elijah, for Paul, and for the Disciples shaken and afraid. It is in that Divine spark, that gentle voice, in that lovingly prepared meal, that we hear the voice of God speaking to us---do not be afraid, it is I, I am here. Have faith and trust in the glimmers of light and hope in the midst of pain and loss.

The glimmer of light and hope in first responders who selflessly give of themselves in devastating times. The glimmer of light and hope in the wonders of medicine and the people who care for us in our time of need. The glimmer of light and hope that is there, even when the earthy life of a loved one is passing. That light shines brightly on the memories of all that came before and all that has made the bond of love and friendship between you both. That cannot be taken away. For this is the Divine. Love in our midst.

So have faith. Take courage. Get up, walk, love courageously, and be the Divine light that God knows you to be.

Welcome back, Parliament of the World's Religions

Wednesday, July 19, 2023

With great joy, I welcome the thousands of people representing more than 80 nations who will gather in Chicago Aug. 13-18 for the Parliament of the World's Religions. My first experience with the parliament came when I traveled to Toronto to deliver a plenary address at the 2018 convening. There I saw firsthand the diversity and vitality found at this largest worldwide gathering dedicated to cultivating harmony among the world's religious and spiritual communities.

This year's theme, "A Call to Conscience: Defending Freedom and Human Rights," urges participants defend the freedom and human rights of all, especially those most in need. Rooted in the diverse beliefs and practices found among the world's religious traditions and spiritual communities, attendees will explore ways to bring about a more just, peaceful and sustainable world. Knowing it is vital that the Catholic Church remain involved in these principled conversations for the good of our community and world, I welcome the opportunity to take part in these discussions as part of a plenary session at the invitation of the parliament leadership.

In his 2020 encyclical, "Fratelli tutti," Pope Francis teaches that "the different religions, based on their respect for each human person as a creature called to be a child of God, contribute significantly to building fraternity and defending justice in society. Dialogue between the followers of different religions does not take place simply for the sake of diplomacy, consideration, or tolerance. In the words of the Bishops of India, 'The goal of dialogue is to establish friendship, peace and harmony, and to share spiritual and moral values and experiences in a spirit of truth and love" (271).

The upcoming convening of the parliament is an opportunity to live out the Holy Father's teaching that a core part of our identity as Catholics involves building friendship between members of different religious traditions. Through our sharing of spiritual and ethical values, we get to know one another. This understanding equips us to address together the social and moral challenges we face in an increasingly secularized world.

The "instrumentum laboris" (working document) for the synod gathering in Rome this October builds on this sentiment when it states that "a synodal church is called to practice the culture of encounter and dialogue with believers of other religions and with cultures and societies in which it is embedded, but above all among the many differences that run through the church itself" (25). Through encountering members of many distinct religious and spiritual communities at the parliament, Catholic participants can better understand and experience the synodal way of dialogue across differences, whether cultural, social or religious.

Moreover, local Catholics will encounter Catholics from Africa, Asia, Europe, Oceania and South America, allowing them to experience firsthand the rich diversity that makes up the global Catholic communion. The parliament is a unique opportunity for Catholics in Chicago to take part in Pope Francis' call to grow into a more synodal church.

Headquartered in Chicago, the parliament has long partnered with the archdiocese to support the goals of interreligious dialogue, and the archdiocese will be well represented at the parliament. Please consider visiting the archdiocesan booth in the exhibit hall, as well as the "Catholic room" dedicated to hospitality for Catholic attendees and anyone else who may want to stop by for conversation or a moment of quiet reflection.

A special on-site Mass is being organized for the Feast of the Assumption on Aug. 15. On Aug. 17, local Christian leaders will gather to jointly sign a declaration affirming our call to care for our planet. Expert theologians, spiritual leaders, artists and practitioners from the Catholic Church and each of the faith traditions found at the parliament will lead hundreds of presentations, workshops, art exhibits, musical performances and films, offering fresh insights and educational opportunities.

For these reasons and many more, I invite you to consider attending the Parliament of the World's Religions as it returns to its birthplace in Chicago. Participating will help you grow in understanding the values and practices that guide members of other religious traditions, while giving you a much broader and deeper understanding of the worldwide Catholic Church. Perhaps most important, it will offer you an opportunity to grow in your own faith and understanding as you share with others what it means to be a Catholic Christian disciple in a changing and remarkably diverse world.

IRM will accompany Fabiola, Jorge and baby Christopher as they move into their own Pilsen apartment this week. IRM will underwrite the first six months of rent for their Pilsen apartment, using the donations you have generously provided to us this year. Earlier an IRM team of volunteers set up a crib and a flat-screen TV that OSP parishioners had donated, in addition to a household full of items—new sheets, pillows, comforters, bath towels, plus dishes, pots & pans, flatware, groceries, and much more that filled their kitchen cabinets. The Chicago Furniture Bank will deliver new beds, plus a gently used sofa, LR chair, dresser, tables, some area rugs, etc. this week. Then the family will be ready to live on their own—following their very long trek from Venezuela and more than two months living "through the kindness of other families" in Chicago and Wilmette.

The rent and utilities for the first six months will be underwritten by IRM with the funds donated by OSP parishioners. Many thanks to parishioners, Dan and Julia Ray for donating wonderful toys and books for these two little boys so they feel at home right away! Family liaisons Lisa Cherivtch and Mary Rodino are making arrangements for little Alan to be registered for first grade just in time for school to start.

BACK-TO-SCHOOL HELP FOR THE IMMIGRANT FAMILIES WE ACCOMPANY

With your generously donated funds IRM has provided some much-needed back-to-school financial assistance to our families from Syria, Myanmar, Honduras, Nicaragua, Colombia and Venezuela with children in grammar and high schools. As many of you know, this is an expensive time of year for families—not just paying school fees, books, new sneakers--but now also for pricey calculators, athletic fees, clothing, uniforms, etc. for all the children to fit in with their peers. This is especially tricky for our immigrant families who are usually making lower wages. IRM is so grateful that generous OSP parishioners have made it possible to help these families in this way.

North Lawndale Works, one of many programs of the North Lawndale Kinship Initiative, began a fund three years ago to give NLEN a way to provide for special needs in removing those barriers for NLEN clients. Through the generosity of Old St. Pat's members, close to \$40,000 was raised and several NLEN clients received the assistance they needed to progress. However, those funds have now been depleted and we are hoping that you'll open your hearts and wallets to help replenish them. 
YOU ARE NOT ALONE (YANA) DIVORCE SUPPORT GROUP

The Partners Program offers thematic classes for children in preschool through Confirmation that enriches their understanding of God, the Church, sacraments, religious holidays, and values. The teachers use stories from Sacred Scriptures and religious textbooks in the classes.



WORKTOUR REFLECTION By Emily White, a graduated senior from Foundations class of 2023, a freshman at George Washington University in the fall

Worktour is an experience that's hard to put into words. I find myself describing it as a service trip but the truth is, it's so much more than that. Yes, service is a huge part of the worktour experience, but after going on 3 worktours, I can confidently say I've received much more than I've given. From the people we've met and worked with to the relationships I've formed and the community we've built, I've gained such valuable memories and experiences from worktour.

This past week in Kansas City, we worked with Habitat for Humanity on both build sites as well as at Restore. For many of us, it can be hard to see God at work in our everyday lives. I know that for me, it's easy to get caught up in routines, to-do lists, and worrying about the future. I struggle to take the time to stop and look for God's presence. Worktour offers us an opportunity to reset and recenter. For me, I see God in the people we work with on worktour. Every night during devotions as I reflect on my day, my mind drifts back to these people. It's truly inspiring to meet people who dedicate their lives to service. I love how worktour pushes me out of my comfort zone to do things I wouldn't have had the courage to do without the support of my community. I learned how to use a table saw, a nail gun, and how to put up insulation to name a few. I also got better at perseverance, teamwork, working hard, and stepping up. And while the work of Habitat for Humanity will continue long after we've returned home, worktour has changed me. It's made me more observant, caring, understanding, and much more. The memories and experiences I've had on worktour will continue to influence me throughout my life.

In addition to the work we do, we spend a lot of time building community with each other. From singing our hearts out in the van, to playing games together, to reflecting on our days together in devotions, I've strengthened my friendships with everyone on this worktour. Something I love about worktour is the ability to disconnect from my everyday life. I can leave the worst of my worries and struggles at home and simply live in the moment with some of my favorite people. I can relax knowing I'll be accepted and loved just as I am. I've never been anywhere else where it's as easy to be vulnerable or feel like I belong. Everyone genuinely cares for each other and everyone has a seat at the table.

These are the days I'll remember 30 years from now and smile about. I stayed up late trying to prolong them, wishing I could stay in those moments. But while worktour might not be able to last forever, the worktour mindset can. I can continue to look for God in my life, be vulnerable, work hard, and say yes to opportunities to serve.







Blessed Michael J. McGivney

Saint of the Day for August 13, 2023

The eldest son of an immigrant Irish family in Connecticut, young Michael left school at 13 to work in a brass factory making spoons. At 16 he began studies for the priesthood in Quebec, but was obliged to leave to help support the family when his father died. Michael completed his education in Baltimore, Maryland, and was ordained for the diocese of Hartford in 1877.

Assigned to St. Mary's Parish in New Haven, Fr. McGivney was very active in parish and civic affairs, serving as director of public plays and fairs. He volunteered to become the guardian of Alfred Downes, a minor whose father had died leaving a large family in poverty. This situation as well as his own family's circumstances and that of other immigrants impressed on Fr. McGivney the need for lay Catholic men to establish a mutual aid society to provide financial assistance for their families if the primary wage earner died. Protestant fraternal groups already provided this type of life insurance protection for their members.

In 1882, Fr. McGivney formed the Knights of Columbus among a small group of St. Mary's parishioners to promote charity, unity, and fraternity, assisting widows and orphans. Because of the Knights' emphasis on serving Church, community and family, the organization grew and did not remain strictly parish-based. Patriotism was added as a founding principle in 1900.

Father McGivney died from pneumonia in 1890 and was buried in Thomaston, Connecticut. Later his body was moved back to St. Mary's in New Haven where it remains today. He was beatified in 2020.


