



WHO DO YOU SAY THAT I AM? By Michael Simone, S.J. **Associate Pastor** Old St Patrick's Church

Every year around this time parishes throughout the United States begin their RCIA programs. These adult catechesis programs (RCIA stands for "Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults") attract people from all walks of life who share one thing in common: a growing interest in following Jesus Christ. Many come to RCIA because they have married (or are going to marry) a Catholic and wish to share the same faith. Others, perhaps raised in a different religious tradition or no tradition at all, come to the program because of study and discernment. Still others come to RCIA for no reason they can articulate, but feel a deep intuition that it represents the next step on their spiritual journey.

Here at Old St. Patrick's, our yearly RCIA program begins on Tuesday, September 12. My favorite part of the first few weeks of RCIA is listening to the faith journeys of the participants. Each journey represents a different response to the question Jesus poses in this Sunday's Gospel: Who do you say that I am? I love these stories because they testify to the continuing presence of Christ, still alive and at work among his people. I also love these stories because they remind me of my own faith journey.

I was a cradle Catholic who got to live a robust version of cultural Catholicism in the late 1970s and early 1980s. My elementary school still had Sisters of Notre Dame in the classrooms, I was an altar server and a lector, we had CYO sports and dances, and becoming a priest or a nun probably crossed everyone's mind for about five minutes. My spiritual life, however, did not begin until high school. Retreats, campus ministry, and some exceptional faith-filled teachers opened my mind to becoming a committed follower of Jesus. One day in religion class I came across Jesus' description of what it meant to be his disciple: "Foxes have dens, birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head" (Mt 8:20). Following this wandering mystic/ preacher was the adventure I was looking for. "Who do you say that I am?" Jesus asked me. "You're basically Leonard Cohen," responded my teen-aged heart, "and I'm all in."

This Sunday's Gospel reading invites all of us to respond to the question, "Who do you say that I am?" The twists and turns of life mean that we will answer that question differently at different points on our journey. At every point, though, our response will lead us deeper into the presence of Jesus Christ alive and still at work among us.

WALKING ON THE SAME ROAD... TOGETHER By Keara Ette Director of Ministries

I have been feeling excitement in the air. Well, I'm also feeling heat and humidity to levels we haven't otherwise seen this summer in Chicago. But in many areas of the world-wide Catholic Church, there seems to be a feeling of excitement. Admittedly, for some Catholics who are aware of things happening in the global church, the feeling might be more one of confusion, of apathy, or even fear and suspicion. But at least for this life-long Catholic, it feels very clear that *something* is happening, and that something feels energizing.

And it is doubtful that Pope Francis spent years laying the groundwork, launching a process to be undertaken by the Catholic church around the world, and finally calling forth ministers, teachers, and members of the Church to meet in Rome for a month-long *Synod* in October of this year, all so that I could feel re-energized, the truth is the same. But it is likely that most of us Catholics (including the bishops, cardinals, and lay and religious clerical leaders around the world) have many questions about exactly what this "Synod on Synodality" is and what will come from it.

So over the course of the next month, the staff and leaders of Old St. Pat's will prepare for and grow in understanding of this Synod (https://www.synod.va/en.html) by offering bulletin articles, podcasts, interviews, prayers, and conversations that will help us learn more about the concept, the objectives, and the structure of this important event and work in the Catholic Church. During the month of October, our community will pray for and with our siblings in Christ as they gather for the Synod, and we will also deepen our own practices of this way of being and doing church together.

Let's use as our launching point, the words of Pope Francis back in 2021 as he preached at the Mass which formally began the Synodal Process, the first stages of which took place in every diocese around the world.

A certain rich man came up to Jesus "as he was setting out on his journey" (Mk 10:17). The Gospels frequently show us Jesus "on a journey"; ... He shows us that God is not found in neat and orderly places, distant from reality, but walks ever at our side. He meets us where we are, on the often rocky roads of life.

Celebrating a Synod means walking on the same road, walking together. Let us look at Jesus. First, he *encounters* the rich man on the road; he then *listens* to his questions, and finally he helps him *discern* what he must do to inherit eternal life. *Encounter*, *listen* and *discern*.

This is the *synodal path*: the work of encountering, listening, and discerning so that the Holy Spirit might guide the church, at all of its levels and in all of its iterations, toward the path set out for us: a path that might contribute to mutual healing and transformation. Over the coming weeks, we will hear from teachers, leaders, and fellow Old St. Pat's members about the synodal path, what has already taken place at the parish, diocese, and national levels around the world, and the issues that the People of God have identified and held up as needing attention and prayerful conversation and discernment. We hope you will join us for this journey, and please look on September 1st at the Old St. Pat's Website to find resources for this journey.

"He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Mt 16:25

Last week's readings were about the 'strangers' in our world and in Jesus' circle. Today he challenges his closest followers to determine whether they know who HE is...really know him or is he a stranger to them as well. Good ol' Peter came through for Jesus. Imagine the relief when he found one close friend who 'gets me – Peter sees me!'. Jesus said to him in reply, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah for flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my heavenly Father." Mt 16:17

Our immigrants and refugees also yearn to find people who 'get' them. They want to be seen! Pause and reflect on how you view our migrant brothers and sisters. If we look at them with our brains – our flesh and blood – we see strangers who are in despair maybe? But who do we say they are if we look at them with our heart – with God's eyes?

Take some time this week to look at the immigrants and refugees in your midst. If there aren't any, go look for some. Last week there was a family sitting outside Target in Oak Park, right on Lake Street! Or reflect on experiences you already had either helping them here or traveling to the border. After you have pondered the question "Who do you say that I am?" send an email to us at immigration@ oldstpats.org. Tell us who you say they are, who God reveals them to be. But also let them know that you see them. Ask where they have come from. Ask their names. Don't speak Spanish? Our smart phones have a translation app on them! Ask what immediate needs you can help secure. Suggest they contact Catholic Charities to get more support (numbers listed below). Be the Church that Jesus built, beginning with Peter – the one who saw him.

THE CHICAGO AREA IS IN LOVE AGAIN WITH PIPING PLOVERS



An estimated 800 pairs of Great Lakes piping plovers once nested on beaches across all the Great Lakes. By the late 1980's that number was down to 13, and only Lake Michigan had piping plover nests. In 1986, these birds were declared endangered species. As ground nesters, they are threatened by nest disturbance and predation, and habitat deterioration both at their nesting and wintering grounds. With recovery efforts, by July 2023, there were 81 breeding piping plover pairs nesting again alongside the Great Lakes.

Chicago's love affair with piping plovers began in 2019, when male and female piping plovers choose to nest at Montrose Beach, on Chicago Park District land. A volunteer group Chicago Piping Plovers soon formed, and began watching the birds, keeping humans and dogs away from the nest. The Park District also cordoned off a part of the beach as a safe space for the birds. The plovers were given the names Monty for the male and Rose for the female, after their nesting spot. That year, the pair raised their first clutch. They spent their winters apart in Texas and Florida, but returned each spring to nest again at Montrose Beach, amazingly around the same date, in 2020 and 2021.

In April 2022, Monty returned to Montrose Beach, but Rose did not. In May Monty died of a fungal infection. In 2022 and 2023, Imani, the son of Monty and Rose, returned to the beach, but no female mate showed up for him, reflecting how few of these endangered birds there really are. In mid-July 2023, three captive raised plover chicks (named Searocket, Prickly Pear, and Wild Indigo after plants of the sandy dunes) were released at Montrose Beach, as part of a collaboration between the US Fish and Wildlife Service, the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, and the Chicago Park District. The hope is that one of these chicks will pair up with Imani, and or will attract another bird, so that in 2024, Montrose Beach will again host breeding Great Lakes Piping Plovers, and we can thrill to their speedy footwork as they hunt for food, and their parenting instincts as they shelter their chicks.

What have the piping plovers at Montrose Beach taught us? That birds and other wildlife can buck the odds, and survive in an urban setting, even on the busiest of beaches. That land can be used, preserved, and even enhanced for other than human purposes, extending far into the future. That we can be charmed by and delight in the grace, resilience, and strength of other species. That the world is richer and more beautiful for the presence of a tiny bird with lightning-fast feet and strong wings that can carry it over 20,000 miles in its lifetime, to return to raise a family at a single spot it recognizes as home.







Saint Monica

Saint of the Day for August 27, 2023

The circumstances of St. Monica's life could have made her a nagging wife, a bitter daughter-in-law, and a despairing parent, yet she did not give way to any of these temptations. Although she was a Christian, her parents gave her in marriage to a pagan, Patricius, who lived in her hometown of Tagaste in North Africa. Patricius had some redeeming features, but he had a violent temper and was licentious. Monica also had to bear with a cantankerous mother-in-law who lived in her home. Patricius criticized his wife because of her charity and piety, but always respected her. Monica's prayers and example finally won her husband and mother-in-law to Christianity. Her husband died in 371, one year after his baptism.

Monica had at least three children who survived infancy. The oldest, Augustine, is the most famous. At the time of his father's death, Augustine was 17 and a rhetoric student in Carthage. Monica was distressed to learn that her son had accepted the Manichean heresy—"all flesh is evil"—and was living an immoral life. For a while, she refused to let him eat or sleep in her house. Then one night she had a vision that assured her Augustine would return to the faith. From that time on, she stayed close to her son, praying and fasting for him. In fact she often stayed much closer than Augustine wanted.

When he was 29, Augustine decided to go to Rome to teach rhetoric. Monica was determined to go along. One night he told his mother that he was going to the dock to say goodbye to a friend. Instead he set sail for Rome. Monica was heartbroken when she learned of Augustine's trick, but she still followed him. She arrived in Rome only to find that he had left for Milan. Although travel was difficult, Monica pursued him to Milan.

In Milan, Augustine came under the influence of the bishop, St. Ambrose, who also became Monica's spiritual director. She accepted his advice in everything and had the humility to give up some practices that had become second nature to her. Monica became a leader of the devout women in Milan as she had been in Tagaste.

She continued her prayers for Augustine during his years of instruction. At Easter 387, St. Ambrose baptized Augustine and several of his friends. Soon after, his party left for Africa. Although no one else was aware of it, Monica knew her life was near the end. She told Augustine, "Son, nothing in this world now affords me delight. I do not know what there is now left for me to do or why I am still here, all my hopes in this world being now fulfilled." She became ill shortly after and suffered severely for nine days before her death.

Almost all we know about St. Monica is in the writings of St. Augustine, especially his Confessions.


