

## "EASTER PEOPLE" SHEILA M. CRONIN Member since 1997

Easter. The longest season in the Catholic Church's calendar. Stretching from Easter Sunday to Pentecost. Fifty days. Or <u>forever</u>, depending on your point of view. Easter is not only the cornerstone of our faith and our singular reason to believe according St. Paul, it is the center around which the balance of church feasts is arranged.

Pope Leo I went so far as to claim that Christmas is celebrated only in preparation for Easter! (Easter people get a kick out of knowing that their favorite feast has supremacy over that big day in December.)

I decided at a young age that I am an Easter person, preferring humble lilies and jelly beans to Christmas's flashier trees and gifts. By age eight I had sustained such significant losses (among them my mother, grandfather, a first grade classmate, a cherished teacher), in my life, that Easter became my beacon of hope. It's the gladdest day of them all, because it promises reunion with our saints in Heaven.

Years later, at a party celebrating the life of a much beloved parish priest, a colorful banner decoration grabbed my attention. Printed boldly across it were the words "Let him Easter in us!" from the poem <u>The Wreck of the Deutschland</u> by Gerard Manley Hopkins. What a discovery! Easter, a verb! Easter, a conviction, a mission statement, a directive as clear as: "Go, spread the word. He is alive!"

\*\*\*\*\*

This Easter season I am facing cancer and surgery. It's a bit bewildering. How do I let Jesus Easter in me now? One way is to continue to assist other writers and authors by reading their works in progress, editing them, and giving experienced feedback. The grace-filled notions of "giving back" and "paying it forward" receive my active endorsement but there is much more to it. For giving back and paying forward are often shown to occur on a horizontal plain. You give me a break and I'll cut you some slack later. You rescue me now and I will help someone else in the future.

All well and good. But incomplete.

However, the work we do, be it paid or volunteer, can become holy when we get out of the way of God's purpose. For it is God's work that we do. St. Paul sums it up in Romans 8:28: "God brings all things to good for those who love him, according to His Purpose." As for what His purpose may be, we cannot know. We rely on faith, hope and love to strengthen us while we feel our way through the dark.

When I was told I had cancer, my sense of self and my creative gifts and even my prayer life took immediate hits. My concentration suffered. I found myself staring in the mirror, confused, wondering who am I now?

Days passed. The confusion persisted. A lifelong fan of good entertainment, scenes from the popular video series <u>The Chosen</u> came to mind. What is truly wonderful about seeing the miracles re-enacted by talented actors is the joy found on the face of Jesus each time He heals. It makes Him happy to heal people. He doesn't want sickness, fear or death to overtake us. He keeps emphasizing to his disciples and to us: this is not the end! There is so much in store for us, it cannot be imagined. The healings we experience in this life, in our bodies, relationships, our spirits, or in those we love or in total strangers, are but a foretaste of the fabulous blessings ahead.

Healing can transcend the experience of having physical disease. It can mean getting out of God's way so He can Easter in me with other cancer patients this year. So now I volunteer at the cancer center where I receive treatment. Yet, around me I often encounter reflections of my own anxiety. There are dark moments, even for a self-proclaimed Easter person.

A scene from the movie <u>Ben-Hur</u> flickers to mind. About forty minutes into the film, a neighbor visits Joseph in his carpentry hutch. The neighbor asks Joseph about his son's whereabouts. "He is out on the hills praying," says an unperturbed Joseph. The neighbor persists. A son should work beside his father, learn his father's trade. Joseph – incomparable fellow – murmurs, "He is working."

Jesus in transition. A wonderfully consoling notion, change being a staple of life. Jesus at prayer. Praying that God's will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

In spite of the headlines, war, disease, family strife and personal losses that cannot be avoided, we strive in this hard 2024 spring to rejoice! and let Him Easter in us.

- They are registered in the U.S. under the Temporary Protected Status (TPS) that will prevent them from being deported. Their fingerprints were taken and are on the data base so if they are ever 'processed', our government knows they are protected and can remain in the U.S.
- They have a social security number now
- They have Employment Authorization Documentation (EAD) now and can work to support themselves!

There were many happy faces filled with pride and renewed dreams. OSP has been subsidizing their rent, but now the parents can obtain work and begin to support themselves. Kathy shows Gabriela how to address the envelope holding the April rent payment. Bob works on a budget spreadsheet with Leo. 



#### Saint John Baptist de La Salle Saint of the Day for April 7, 2024

Complete dedication to what he saw as God's will for him dominated the life of John Baptist de La Salle. In 1950, Pope Pius XII named him patron of schoolteachers for his efforts in upgrading school instruction. As a young 17th-century Frenchman, John had everything going for him: scholarly bent, good looks, noble family background, money, refined upbringing. At the early age of 11, he received the tonsure and started preparation for the priesthood, to which he was ordained at 27. He seemed assured then of a life of dignified ease and a high position in the Church.

But God had other plans for John, which were gradually revealed to him in the next several years. During a chance meeting with Monsieur Adrien Nyel, he became interested in the creation of schools for poor boys in Rheims, where he was stationed. Though the work was extremely distasteful to him at first, he became more involved in working with the deprived youths.

Once convinced that this was his divinely appointed mission, John threw himself wholeheartedly into the work, left home and family, abandoned his position as canon at Rheims, gave away his fortune, and reduced himself to the level of the poor to whom he devoted his entire life.

The remainder of his life was closely entwined with the community of religious men he founded, the Brothers of the Christian School (also called Christian Brothers or De La Salle Brothers). This community grew rapidly and was successful in educating boys of poor families, using methods designed by John. It prepared teachers in the first training college for teachers and also set up homes and schools for young delinquents of wealthy families. The motivating element in all these endeavors was the desire to become a good Christian.

Yet even in his success, John did not escape experiencing many trials: heart-rending disappointment and defections among his disciples, bitter opposition from the secular schoolmasters who resented his new and fruitful methods, and persistent opposition from the Jansenists of his time, whose moral rigidity and pessimism about the human condition John resisted vehemently all his life.

Afflicted with asthma and rheumatism in his last years, he died on Good Friday at age 68, and was canonized in 1900.

Complete dedication to one's calling by God, whatever it may be, is a rare quality. Jesus asks us to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength" (Mark 12:30b, emphasis added). Paul gives similar advice: "Whatever you do, do from the heart..." (Colossians 3:23).


