

Dear Friends,

I am delighted to share with you that Fr. Simone professed his solemn (final) vows as a Jesuit this weekend in a Mass with his local Jesuit community. We all offer our congratulations to him and thank God for the gift of his vocation.

You may wonder why it is only now in Fr. Michael's life as a Jesuit that he is professing solemn vows. He joined the Jesuits in 1997 and was ordained in 2007. As with many Jesuit things, the explanation is a bit complicated!

Members of religious orders take two kinds of vows, simple and solemn. For Jesuits, simple vows, sometimes known as *first vows*, usually happen around two years after joining. After completing a period of training called the *novitiate*, Jesuits profess vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. The biggest change for most Jesuits at this point is that they can start using the initials "S.J." after their name, indicating that they are now a vowed member of the Society of Jesus. Jesuits hoping to become priests after first vows are known as *scholastics* and spend several more years in work and study to prepare for the priesthood. A Jesuit scholastic who is eligible for the priesthood is called to a ceremony called *ordination*, after which time he can say mass and use the title "Father." Only after several more years of work and study are Jesuit priests called to solemn vows. A few months ago, the provincial of the USA Midwest Jesuits informed Fr. Simone that he had been called to make solemn (final) vows. Final vows indicate that a Jesuit has prepared himself to be available to work anywhere in the world that the Society of Jesus has a mission. It marks the transition from preparation to full participation in the order.





GREEN NOTES FROM OSP GREEN TEAM: CELEBRATE EARTH DAY AND BE INSPIRED BY ONE EARTH FILM FESTIVAL

The first Earth Day was celebrated on April 22, 1970. Senator Gaylord Nelson from Wisconsin and others advocated for a day in early spring when people everywhere could take time to educate themselves about environmental issues, and advocate for changes that would produce a more sustainable world. About 20 million people participated in the first Earth Day. They attended educational events at schools and colleges; volunteered to collect trash at local parks, forests, rivers, and beaches; participated in tree plantings and other events; and advocated for environmental legislation. Those efforts bore fruit, as the 1970's saw the passage of several important environmental bills, including the Clean Air and Clean Water Act; and the establishment of the Environmental Protection Agency.

In 2024, 54 years after the first Earth Day, Earth Day continues to be celebrated across the world, with one billion people in 193 countries expected to join in. The theme for 2024's Earth Day is "Planet vs. Plastic," calling attention to the effects of single use plastics on our world. The health of our world and ourselves depends on reduction in their use. Microplastics have emerged in recent years as a significant threat, especially to children living in the global South.

Your local forest preserve, park, or nature center likely has activities planned around Earth Day. And you can visit the earthday.org website for an interactive global map showing Earth Day events.

From its beginnings in 2012, the One Earth Film Festival has grown into the Midwest's premier showcase for environmental films. This year the One Earth Film Festival takes place from April 17 to April 23, spanning Earth Day. In 2024, the festival includes five days of live screenings, and two days of virtual events. Showings take place at multiple locations, including the city itself and its suburbs. Venues include local churches, libraries, theatres, and the Peggy Notebart Nature Museum. Tickets are generally free, with an \$8 suggested donation.

The movies featured in this year's festival cover vital issues like regenerative agriculture, rain forest protection, gentrification, young filmmakers' voices, ecofeminism, and water justice. In "Wings of Dust," learn about a Peruvian Indigenous journalist who risks his life so his son can have a future with clean water. "A Good Neighbor" tells the story of a Latina single mother who campaigns for city council in one of our country's most polluted zip codes. The film "Common Ground" demonstrates the power of regenerative agriculture to heal our soils, our lives, and the world's ecosystems. We ask for your strength to give us wisdom and courage to protect our earthly environment from destruction and overuse.



We'll catch up and decide on the next book from 6:30 PM - 7:00 PM, and discuss the book from 7-8.





About the Archdiocese of Chicago's Healing Garden

The Healing Garden of the Archdiocese of Chicago is a place dedicated to the healing, recovery and reconciliation of child abuse victims and their families, a place where the community comes together each year during the month of April which is observed as National Child Abuse Prevention Month.

"Yes, ours is a Church of many nations and many cultures, a diversity that we must respect, but zero tolerance when it comes to harming children and full accountability are non-negotiable. These are not values to be held in the abstract, or simply codified as a list of procedures to be ticked off as a matter of routine. No, they must be lived values. They must be values that permeate the very air we breathe as a Church—so that everyone from the volunteer tutor to the bishop knows that building a culture of accountability, justice and healing is essential to what it means to be church, to follow Christ's call."

History of The Blue Ribbon and Pinwheels

The blue ribbon has been a national symbol of child-abuse awareness since 1989 when Bonnie Finney, a grandmother whose 3-year-old grandson died at the hands of his mother's abusive boyfriend, tied a blue ribbon to her van as a support of her personal commitment to involve everyone in the effort to raise awareness of child abuse.

While the blue ribbon has served the purpose of increasing awareness of the prevalence of abuse and neglect in communities, a new message able to advance the prevention of abuse and neglect in terms of behavior change, societal solutions and policy priorities was needed. The message shifted from the problem of abuse to the solution of effective prevention: Therefore, a symbol that would represent this shift and provide an imagery of healthy child development was identified. In 2004, PCA Florida selected the pinwheel and adopted Winds of Change as the statewide campaign. In 2008, PCA America adopted the pinwheel and created a national signature campaign called Pinwheels for Prevention.





Blessed Peter Gonzalez

Saint of the Day for April 14, 2024

Saint Paul had a conversion experience on the road to Damascus. Many years later, the same proved true for Peter Gonzalez, who triumphantly rode his horse into the Spanish city of Astorga in the 13th century to take up an important post at the cathedral. The animal stumbled and fell, leaving Peter in the mud and onlookers amused.

Humbled, Peter reevaluated his motivations—his bishop-uncle had secured the cathedral post for him—and started down a new path. He became a Dominican priest and proved to be a most effective preacher. He spent much of his time as court chaplain, and attempted to exert positive influence on the behavior of members of the court. After King Ferdinand III and his troops defeated the Moors at Cordoba, Peter was successful in restraining the soldiers from pillaging, and persuaded the king to treat the defeated Moors with compassion.

After retiring from the court, Peter devoted the remainder of his life to preaching in northwest Spain. Having developed a special mission to Spanish and Portuguese seamen, he is considered their patron.

Peter Gonzalez died in 1246 and was beatified in 1741.

How often we have heard stories about some misfortune or disaster only to hear later on that it was now seen as a good thing. Not every "disaster" is truly bad in its consequences for the Lord can bring good out of what appears to be a misfortune. Such was the case for Blessed Peter. His being dumped in the mud by a falling horse turned out to be a good thing in his life.



Sunday Parking:




