

HOLY ENERGY

As I get older (and perhaps busier, though that is arguable), the question of energy tends to keep coming up for me. I consider how much energy a new endeavor is going to demand of me and of course, how much energy my family and friends deserve from me. And the math associated with the energy in life can be a little less than straightforward. I mean, there is the natural energy that grace seems to send at different life moments, and then there is the energy that I realize I need to create to make it through the things that are particularly difficult and/or not in my wheelhouse. (I call this "manufactured energy" and it can be costly.) So the question on a loop is: How much energy do I have and how much (more) do I need?

So as I have been praying with the Gospel for this Sunday - the story of Jesus encountering the woman at the well - perhaps it makes sense that I noticed something about energy movement that I have not previously recognized in this story.

This time, I find it interesting that Jesus stays at the well and his followers - who have also been walking all morning - continue into the town to get food. Perhaps Jesus waits there because he is extra tired, or because his followers don't have the energy to handle the slightly chaotic scene that will undoubtedly unfold if he entered the town with them. Regardless of the reason, when a woman of the region comes to draw water (strikingly by herself and in the heat of the day - both potential signals of her marginal place in society), he asks her for a drink, presumably because he hopes to quench his thirst.

When she responds with shock and confusion, Jesus seems to see an opening, and he goes for it. No longer is he focused on liquid water from the well. Now he is going to draw her deeper - to help her identify the depth of her own thirst - her thirst for healing, for peace, for wholeness, for fullness of life. Jesus sees deep into the woman's soul and invites her to see who he truly is as well. As his disciples arrive and witness the end of the conversation, they say nothing as the woman abandons her water jar and goes back to the city to tell everyone about the encounter. Likely not having the energy or wherewithal to inquire about Jesus' conversation, the disciples focus on taking care of Jesus' practical needs. "Rabbi, eat," they urge him.

My energy-seeking heart now imagines Jesus taking in a deep sigh before he responds, basically, "I'm good now, thanks." Jesus' proverbial 'tank' seems to have been filled back up by the tender conversation - the personal connection - with this woman who was supposed to be the epitome of 'other' in the eyes of a Jewish rabbi. But instead, they each left quenched of thirst, relieved of hunger, and energized for the mission in front of them.

With the example and help of Jesus, may we commit ourselves to the moments of human connection through which the energy of Love might renew our world.



THE IMMIGRANT & REFUGEE MINISTRY (IRM) IS SEEKING AN AFFORDABLE 2 BR APARTMENT FOR AN INCOMING FAMILY

Finding affordable housing is a real challenge for resettling immigrant families. If you—or someone you know—has a nice 2 BR apartment available for rent in the Chicago area in the next few months, IRM would like to connect with you. IRM will accompany this asylum seeking or refugee family and provide personal assistance and support to the family, i.e., finding a job, registering children for school, etc. The apartment will ideally be located near public transportation and be under \$1,500 monthly. Renting to this family will be an important element in launching them successfully.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES TO LAUNCH A NEW ARCHDIOCESAN ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR ASYLUM SEEKERS IN LATE MARCH

IRM has worked with Catholic Charities to develop a program to serve asylum seekers bussed into the Chicago area from Texas. A number of Archdiocesan parishes have shown an interest with 11 already signing on. The goal is to engage 21 in this Parish Sponsorship Model. Parishes have the option of covering the cost of financially supporting a family of asylum seekers (\$10,000), accompanying them, or both. Catholic Charities will provide the case management support for the families and are still figuring out options for housing and legal support for this program.



Blessed Angela Salawa

Saint of the Day for March 12, 2023

Angela served Christ and Christ's little ones with all her strength.

Born in Siepraw, near Kraków, Poland, she was the 11th child of Bartlomiej and Ewa Salawa. In 1897, she moved to Kraków where her older sister Therese lived. Angela immediately began to gather together and instruct young women domestic workers. During World War I, she helped prisoners of war without regard for their nationality or religion. The writings of Teresa of Avila and John of the Cross were a great comfort to her.

Angela gave great service in caring for soldiers wounded in World War I. After 1918, her health did not permit her to exercise her customary apostolate. Addressing herself to Christ, she wrote in her diary, "I want you to be adored as much as you were destroyed." In another place, she wrote, "Lord, I live by your will. I shall die when you desire; save me because you can."

At her 1991 beatification in Kraków, Pope John Paul II said: "It is in this city that she worked, that she suffered and that her holiness came to maturity. While connected to the spirituality of Saint Francis, she showed an extraordinary responsiveness to the action of the Holy Spirit" (L'Osservatore Romano, volume 34, number 4, 1991).

Humility should never be mistaken for lack of conviction, insight or energy. Angela brought the Good News and material assistance to some of Christ's "least ones." Her selfsacrifice inspired others to do the same.
