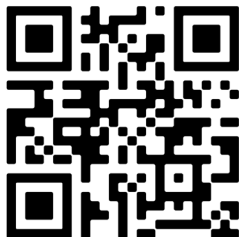
Let this Easter season be a new springtime for us personally, our parishes and our archdiocese as we continue our renewal and commitment to be missionaries of hope to a world so much need.

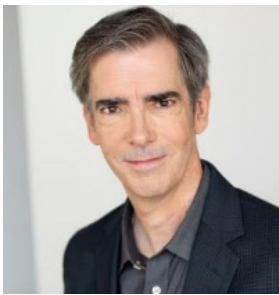

GREEN NOTES FROM OSP GREEN TEAM: THE ISSUE WITH TISSUE



“When we are in a forest among the trees, we’re with our ancestors, our elder relatives. The trees are talking to us. The question is, are we listening?”

Since 2019, the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC) has issued a scorecard ranking the sustainability of consumer tissue products (toilet paper, paper towels, facial tissue). Their goal is to highlight a little-known connection between these products and the destruction of boreal forests. The boreal forest is the northernmost and coldest forest on earth, covering vast tracts in Alaska, Canada, Russia, Scandinavia, and northeastern China, extending into parts of far northern United States in Idaho, Montana, and Minnesota. The trees in boreal forests are the conifers spruce, fir, pine, and the deciduous conifer larch, as well as the deciduous trees birch and aspen. This forest is characterized by long cold winters and short growing seasons, only 50-130 days long. Because of the frigid climate, trees are typically short, in some cases only 15 to 20 feet tall. But the boreal forest supports wildlife seen nowhere else, including woodland caribou, marten, lynx, and moose, and many species of migrating birds, that summer and raise their young in the far north. And it is the home of 600 communities of indigenous people in Canada, whose culture is intimately tied up with ecosystems where they live.

So, what is the connection between boreal forests and tissue products? Many companies, including many American companies, are now clearcutting this forest, especially in Canada, at alarming rates to produce toilet paper, paper towels, and facial tissue. Canada is now third behind Brazil and Russia in loss of forest acreage, and accounts for 15% of all intact worldwide forest loss between 2000 and 2013. Between 1996 and 2015, Canada lost 28 million acres of virgin boreal forest to clear cutting, an area equivalent in size to the state of Ohio. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) notes that preserving forests worldwide is essential to avoiding catastrophic effects from climate change, and is critical to maintaining biodiversity and resilience in our climate altered world. The NRDC argues that we have created a tree to toilet pipeline by the industrial clear cutting of virgin boreal forests in Canada.

Consumers can be part of the solution to our issues with tissue, through their buying choices.

- Become familiar with NRDC’s rating of tissue products, and, when feasible, select products with A or B ratings. See <https://www.nrdc.org/sites/default/files/issue-with-tissue-2022-scorecard.pdf>
- Look for tissue products made from 100% recycled content, which use ½ the water, release 1/3 greenhouse gases and ½ the air pollutants, and need no bleaching, compared to virgin pulp.
- Look for Forest Service Council (FSC) Certification on tissue products you buy. This certification helps ensure that forest harvests promote biodiversity and conservation, and support indigenous voices.
- Choose tissue products made from alternative sources of pulp like bamboo and wheat straw.

How amazing that the simple act of purchasing home tissue products can be part of preventing species loss, avoiding climate change, and practicing sustainability! Let’s do it!

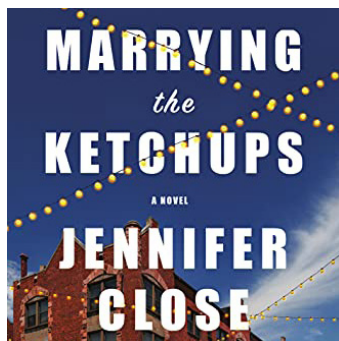

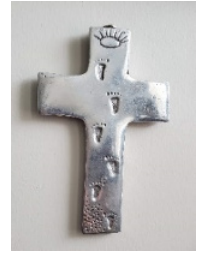

MEET AZIMAH, NORHAN AND AZIMI, FORMERLY OF MYANMAR

When Azimah was only five years old, she and her family, composed of eight children and their parents, left Myanmar, formerly Burma, in a van. They headed to Thailand and then to Malaysia. Azimah traveled in the trunk of the van. She laughs about it now, but it was not a laughing matter then.

The family lived in a refugee house in Malaysia. Girls went to school only until fourth grade; most got married shortly after that. Boys went to school until sixth grade; then they went to work to help support the family. She met her husband, Norhan, in Malaysia, got married, and had a child, a wonderful son, Azimi. They knew they had to leave. "There was no future in Malaysia", said Azimah.

Fast forward to Chicago. Their son was four years old then. Catholic Charities and Old St. Pat's Immigrant & Refugee Ministry (IRM) members Julie Durkin, Sharon O'Brien, and Pat Hamill helped to establish this family in Chicago. They showed them how to use the CTA, registered Azimi at school, procured library cards, took them to zoos and museums, got their green cards, and marriage license corrected, connected them to their Muslim Community. Respect and friendships grew.

To finish the story—or perhaps begin anew—Azimah has now procured her GED Certificate, State of Illinois High School Diploma. She has been studying science, social studies, math, language arts and, of course, English; and Norhan is well situated with a job at Jiffy Lube. When I asked Azimah, "What was your greatest challenge in establishing your life in Chicago?" She answered, "It is such a privilege to be here! I am able to be educated. My son can be anything he wants to be. He has a future. We have a dream, which we can achieve."

Saint Casilda

Saint of the Day for April 9, 2023

Some saints' names are far more familiar to us than others, but even the lives of obscure holy persons teach us something.

And so it is with Saint Casilda. Her father was a Muslim leader in Toledo, Spain, in the 10th century. Casilda was a devout Muslim but was kind to Christian prisoners. She became ill as a young woman but did not trust that any of the local Arab doctors could cure her. So she made a pilgrimage to the shrine of San Vincenzo in northern Spain. Like so many other people who made their way there—many of them suffering from hemorrhages—Casilda sought the healing waters of the shrine. We're uncertain what brought her to the shrine, but we do know that she left it relieved of illness.

In response, she became a Christian and lived a life of solitude and penance not far from the miraculous spring. It's said that she lived to be 100 years old. Her death likely occurred around the year 1050.

Tensions between Muslims and Christians have often existed throughout history, sometimes resulting in bloody conflict. Through her quiet, simple life Casilda served her Creator—first in one faith, then in another.
