My mother, Lillian Guider, was born in the early 1900s. In addition to being a devoted wife, mother, grandmother, and woman of God, she was also a cherished friend and inspiration to many. Her cheer, respect, creativity, responsibility, and deep Christian faith caused coworkers, neighbors, church members, and friends and family members alike to hold her in high regard. Those who knew Mom well would frequently declare, "Lillian is such a wonderful woman!"

Unlike many African Americans who had migrated from the Jim Crow South to Northern cities during Mom's early years, she was a native Chicagoan - a south side girl through and through. Her optimism and love for the community kept her engaged in numerous social, civic, and church related projects. Next to being a devoted wife and mother, she also took great pleasure in enriching other people's lives whenever and however she could. She prayed, marched, cooked, encouraged, coached, den mothered, decorated, sewed, and rolled up her sleeves to do anything she could for the common good. Although many dedicated adults poured valuable lessons into me in church and schools when I was a youngster, my mom served as my first, best, and most consistent teacher about God's presence and love. Lillian's beautiful legacy shaped me, and it abides in me today.

How blessed we are when godly women touch our lives. Mothers, grandmothers, wives, sisters, aunts, teachers, coaches, counselors, godmothers, religious women, caregivers of various sorts, mentors, neighbors, and other women make indelible impressions on us from the womb to the tomb. So here's to our female purveyors of morals, advocates of good habits, singers of sweet songs, deliverers of comfort, hard lessons and hope, shining sources of smiles, and deliverers of a correcting or tender touch when we need it. You are our blueprints for love. We are better off because of your care, and it is inconceivable that we could carry on without you.

I can no longer physically be with the incredible women who shaped me in my youth; they are among the ancestors now. Still, they and God's Spirit remain with me, and through the cosmos, somehow I remain with them. When Jesus exhorts in this Sunday's gospel, "We are not left as orphans", he reminds us that He is one with the Father and us (John 14:15-21).

So, let us thank God for the phenomenal women who have been with us and for our God dwelling within them!

BLESSING OF MOTHERS





FAMILY UPDATES

Our Syrian family continues to do very well ...

Dalya and Ziad, our Syrian family's mom and dad, who became U.S. citizens last year, were thrilled to cast their first ballots this year, reminding all of us that we should never take the privilege to vote for granted.

Amar, their second oldest child, a junior at Maine South Township in Park Ridge, is one of 16 students chosen from more than 300 applicants for a training program to become a certified nursing assistant (CNA). He will participate in this training over the next year. Upon completion of the training, Amar will be qualified as a CNA. Since his objective is to become a doctor eventually, he looks forward to this as a stepping stone to his ultimate career goal.

IRM will accompany a small family from the Central African Republic ...

Working through Catholic Charities, IRM will soon begin to accompany a mother, Opportune, and Souleymane, her 18 year-old son, currently housed on the north side near Loyola University. They come to us from the Central African Republic. Despite its significant mineral deposits and other natural resources, Central African Republic, which was a French colony until 1960, remains one of the 10 poorest countries in the world. Stay tuned as we get to know this new family.

Our family liaison team is composed of Pat Hamill, Marion O'Connell, Nancy Green and Lisa Cherivtch. Fortunately, Lisa is a seasoned ESL teacher with some knowledge of French, which is the family's primary language although they do speak some English.

IRM will also begin to accompany another family from Haiti soon.

They are a family of four--mom and dad with two older children--who come to us through the State Department's new program launched earlier this year, The Welcome Corps. This ambitious new program has invited U.S. private citizens to help resettle 5,000 refugees in 2023 and commit to accompaniment and friendship, to secure housing, and connect to ongoing support/services and organizations. This Haitian family is known to one of our volunteers, Julia Holmertz, who recommended this family to IRM. Our members Julia and Mary Rodino will co-chair this new IRM program.

Do you have an interest in teaching English as a Second Language? We are looking for volunteers to help with our Refugee/Asylum Seeker Ministry. If you have experience, great! If you haven't taught ESL, but have an interest, we can train you.

Our Lady of Fatima

Saint of the Day for May 13, 2023

Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese children–Francisco and Jacinta Marto and their cousin Lucia dos Santos–received apparitions of Our Lady at Cova da Iria near Fatima, a city 110 miles north of Lisbon. Mary asked the children to pray the rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia.

Mary gave the children three secrets. Following the deaths of Francisco and Jacinta in 1919 and 1920 respectively, Lucia revealed the first secret in 1927. It concerned devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The second secret was a vision of hell. When Lucia grew up she became a Carmelite nun and died in 2005 at the age of 97.

Pope John Paul II directed the Holy See's Secretary of State to reveal the third secret in 2000; it spoke of a "bishop in white" who was shot by a group of soldiers who fired bullets and arrows into him. Many people linked this vision to the assassination attempt against Pope John Paul II in St. Peter's Square on May 13, 1981.

The feast of Our Lady of Fatima was approved by the local bishop in 1930; it was added to the Church's worldwide calendar in 2002.

The message of Fatima is simple: Pray. Unfortunately, some people—not Sister Lucia—have distorted these revelations, making them into an apocalyptic event for which they are now the only reliable interpreters. They have, for example, claimed that Mary's request that the world be consecrated to her has been ignored. Sister Lucia agreed that Pope John Paul Il's public consecration in St. Peter's Square on March 25, 1984, fulfilled Mary's request. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith prepared a June 26, 2000, document explaining the "third secret."

Mary is perfectly honored when people generously imitate her response "Let it be done to me as you say" (Luke 1:38). Mary can never be seen as a rival to Jesus or to the Church's teaching authority, as exercised by the college of bishops united with the bishop of Rome.
