

WE ARE IN THE WORLD

"And now I will no longer be in the world, but they are in the world, while I am coming to you." - John 17: 1-11a

In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus' final farewell and his acceptance of death as he is ascended into Heaven. He accepts his time on Earth, and His life's commitment to the Father.

The most powerful statement, in my opinion, is the ending of the Gospel reading, "And now I will no longer be in the world, but they are in the world, while I am coming to you." Jesus entrusts his mission to his Apostles - to continue spreading the Word of the Lord and living in Christ's image. He knows that they are believers of God and that they accept the preaching of the Lord as instructions towards eternal glory. He trusts that they will be good stewards of God's words and love. It is a reminder that although Christ is no longer with us on earth, he will live on in the worship of his followers.

Today, we are asked to continue being stewards of the mission and to be disciples of God. Although thousands of years later, there is still much evil in our world. Racism, sexism, war, greed, poverty, violence.... the list goes on. It is of the utmost importance for us as Christians to acknowledge the hatred and injustice in the world and combat it with love. These are the values that we have been taught by the Gospel, our parental figures, our teachers, and our neighbors. When we actively live these values: feed the hungry, house the homeless, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger - then we as a church are good disciples of God.

Just last week, I was moved by the dedication of our Immigrant and Refugee Ministry at Old St. Pat's. Over the course of the week, asylum seekers came to our community to ask for resources. In the final week of our Director of Social Justice's time at Old St. Pat's, Kayla Jackson (who will be a little angry with this shout-out) and the members of her ministry shot into action, just as they do every time there are people in need of help and kindness. After the 5 PM Mass, friends and members of OSP gathered to make care packages for these asylum seekers that have sought help. It is not enough to say you are a follower of God if you do not prove it through action. It is in selfless acts of love and charity that we truly live the Word of the Lord.

Thank you to **Kayla Jackson**, our Director of Social Justice, who has dedicated her life to Old St. Pat's over the last 5 years. She will be greatly missed, but we are excited for her next adventure working at her alma mater, Dominican University, as the University Campus Minister.

WELLNESS CORNER

The Power of Social Connection

May is Mental Health Month and a good time to highlight the importance of being in community. One of the lessons learned from our time during the pandemic was the impact of loneliness and isolation that many experienced due to being cut off from support systems. Recently highlighted by a report from Dr. Vivek Murthy, US Surgeon General, loneliness and isolation are associated with a greater risk of cardiovascular disease, dementia, stroke, depression, anxiety, and premature death. Murthy stresses the importance of strengthening our relationships by supporting community efforts to rebuild social connection. Some simple steps:

- **Understand the power of social** connection and the consequences of social disconnection by learning how the vital components can impact your relationships, health, and well-being.
- Invest time in nurturing your relationships through frequent **engagement with others**. Take time each day to reach out to a friend or family member.
- **Minimize distraction** during conversations to increase the quality of the time you spend with others. Put electronics away during meals with friends, important conversations, and family time.
- Seek out opportunities to serve and support others.
- Be responsive, supportive, and **practice gratitude**. As we practice these behaviors, others are more likely to reciprocate, strengthening our social bonds, improving relationship satisfaction, and building social capital.
- Actively engage with people of different backgrounds and experiences to expand your understanding of and relationships with others, given the benefits associated with diverse connections.
- **Participate** in social and community groups to foster a sense of belonging, meaning, and purpose. Make time for civic engagement.
- **Reduce** practices that lead to feelings of disconnection from others. These include harmful and excessive social media use, time spent in unhealthy relationships, and disproportionate time in front of **screens** instead of people.
- **Seek help** during times of struggle with loneliness or isolation by reaching out to a family member, friend, or licensed therapist.

Old St. Pat's offers many opportunities to connect, volunteer, and rebuild social connection. We look forward to working together to build lives and communities that are healthier and happier.

Today's first reading finds the disciples, Mary the mother of Jesus and other relatives waiting in the upper room. They hope for the coming of the Holy Spirit but there is no certainty. They face the unknown and they are seeking help.

They too have hope for a brighter future but also lack certainty. They face the unknown in a new land and are looking for help - our help. In the Gospel, Jesus prays for his followers. Prayer is important. Spend time today in silence, listening for God's voice. Imagine yourself waiting in the upper room. What are you hoping for? How might the Spirit come to you? Are you hearing a call to help others?





PARTNERS RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (K-8th Grade)

It's been said that it takes a village to raise a child. Here at Old St. Patrick's we believe it takes a community to help us on the journey to "find" God. With this in mind, the Partners Program was created to form a connection with parents to bring religious education to the children in our community.



The Partners Program offers thematic classes for children in preschool through Confirmation that enriches their understanding of God, the Church, sacraments, religious holidays, and values. The teachers use stories from Sacred Scriptures and religious textbooks in the classes. Parents are expected to participate in workshops on the first Sunday of each month to help develop the monthly theme at home and foster the partnership.

Classes are held twice a month on Sunday mornings from 10:15 to 11:30 in the Frances Xavier Warde School classrooms from September through April. Registration for Partners Religious Education is now open and closes before the first class takes place in September 2023.

Important Information:

- First Communion typically takes place when a child is in 2nd grade. OSP requires one year of Religious Education PRIOR to registering for First Communion.
- Reconciliation typically takes place in 3rd grade.
- Confirmation is a two year process which begins in 7th grade.




Service: Foundations works with many different organizations in the Chicagoland area to provide service to those in need. Participating in service is a great way to get involved with Foundations while giving back to the community!



Saint Cristóbal Magallanes and Companions

Saint of the Day for May 21, 2023

Like Blessed Miguel Agustín Pro, SJ, Cristóbal and his 24 companion martyrs lived under a very anti-Catholic government in Mexico, one determined to weaken the Catholic faith of its people. Churches, schools, and seminaries were closed; foreign clergy were expelled. Cristóbal established a clandestine seminary at Totatiche, Jalisco. He and the other priests were forced to minister secretly to Catholics during the presidency of Plutarco Calles (1924-28).

All of these martyrs except three, were diocesan priests. David, Manuel and Salvador were laymen who died with their parish priest, Luis Batis. They all belonged to the Cristero movement, pledging their allegiance to Christ and to the Church that he established, to spread the Good News in society—even if Mexico's leaders had made it a crime to receive baptism or celebrate the Mass.

These martyrs did not die as a single group but over 22 years time in eight Mexican states, with Jalisco and Zacatecas having the largest number. They were beatified in 1992 and canonized eight years later.

Every martyr realizes how to avoid execution, but refuses to pay the high price of doing so. A clear conscience was more valuable than a long life. We may be tempted to compromise our faith while telling ourselves that we are simply being realistic, dealing with situations as we find them. Is survival reality the ultimate value? Do our concrete, daily choices reflect our deepest values, the ones that allow us to "tick" the way we do? Anyone can imagine situations in which being a follower of Jesus is easier than the present situation. Saints remind us that our daily choices, especially in adverse circumstances, form the pattern of our lives.
