




HAPPY PRIDE MONTH

Let us join together, not only this month but every day, to celebrate and join in prayer with our LGBTQ+ community.

Our salvation is rooted in Jesus' sacrifice for us. When a person has love, one experiences God. When a person has love, one grows in grace and lives in peace. Put simply, John explains that when we become children of God, a radical transformation happens. The presence of this kind of love, then, offers us a kind of assurance of our connection to God's promises. When we read "God loved the world so much" our focus is immediately put on us. It makes the Father's motivation for sacrificing his Son the amount of his love for humanity, as if God simply could not do without us and would do anything for us.

Perhaps how we know we are loved and valued is more than a matter of just hearing the words. Love has something to do with fidelity: showing up, being there, not leaving when the stampede is moving in the direction of the door. People will understand the reality of the incarnation when they intimately encounter love. Love makes sacrifices, shares times of want along with seasons of plenty. Love generously supports and honestly challenges. Love lets go when the time is right.

Have you noticed how often the Old Testament speaks about the alien, the fatherless, the widow, the weak and the oppressed? Quite clearly, the God of the Old Testament is the God who "loves justice". It is not always easy to be led spiritually because it takes some humility and dependence on God. I believe that God calls us to be women and men of faith who trust with humility that we can manifest the compassion of Jesus to those in need, especially those who are denied respect for their human dignity. I believe that our lives are guided by the fire of the Holy Spirit. A Spirit who quickens our love; and helps us to be open and responsive, like Mary, to the needs of people in our care.

Richard Rohr would suggest: Your life situation is not your life; it is the portal to your life. It is the place you fall into your life. We fall down, we fall short, we fall out, but we seldom forget, home is not just a place where they let you stay but a place where you belong and are beloved.

When we are sent to love, do we love without conditions and boundaries? When we are sent to share love, do we share it willingly and joyfully with others?

We are given the Spirit; and we exist like Christ, not for ourselves but for others. Thus, we will have hard work to do, with and for each other. The word eucatastrophe means an unexpected happening that brings goodness out of devastation. I suspect that this week's Gospel helps us to make meaning out of our pain and to celebrate the stillness found as we allow Jesus to nourish us on our Journey to know ourselves as truly Loved.



PARTNERS RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (K-8th Grade)

It's been said that it takes a village to raise a child. Here at Old St. Patrick's we believe it takes a community to help us on the journey to "find" God.

With this in mind, the Partners Program was created to form a connection with parents to bring religious education to the children in our community.



The Partners Program offers thematic classes for children in preschool through Confirmation that enriches their understanding of God, the Church, sacraments, religious holidays, and values. The teachers use stories from Sacred Scriptures and religious textbooks in the classes. Parents are expected to participate in workshops on the first Sunday of each month to help develop the monthly theme at home and foster the partnership.

Classes are held twice a month on Sunday mornings from 10:15 to 11:30 in the Frances Xavier Warde School classrooms from September through April. Registration for Partners Religious Education is now open and closes before the first class takes place in September 2023.

Important Information:

- First Communion typically takes place when a child is in 2nd grade. OSP requires one year of Religious Education PRIOR to registering for First Communion.
- Reconciliation typically takes place in 3rd grade.
- Confirmation is a two year process which begins in 7th grade.

Mass: Foundations hosts the 9:30 a.m. Mass on the first Sunday of the month. Foundations teens are encouraged to participate as Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, Hospitality Ministers, Choir members on the first Sunday of the month, and at any other Mass throughout the month.

Fun: Foundations facilitates many fun events outside of its regular meetings! We have been to play whirlyball, lasertag, and even went to a trampoline park. During the summer, we host Park Games every Tuesday night in the park across from the church from 7 – 9 p.m. We play sports and just hang out. Other fun events include retreats and Worktours!

Retreats: Foundations provides opportunities to go on 5 different retreats throughout high school that explore themes of faith, social justice, and inner reflection. Retreats are a great opportunity to get away from your daily life and focus on reconnecting with yourself and with God. They are also a ton of fun and are a great way to bond with other Foundations teens.

Worktour: Foundations teens have the opportunity to take part in a weeklong service trip that teens can participate in each summer to help out an area of the country in need whilst also learning about issues of social justice on their yearly "Worktour." For example, Foundations teens that have attended Worktour have provided disaster relief in Oklahoma and New Orleans; discussed Civil Rights in Birmingham, Alabama; explored immigration near the border in Texas, and examined the education system in Washington, D.C.





OSP HOSPITALITY AND EUCHARISTIC MINISTER TRAINING

Our Vision Statement pillar of 'exquisite liturgy' finds its foundation in the many people who make our liturgies at Old St. Patrick's a welcoming, vibrant, and lifegiving experience. Today's second reading from Corinthians begins with a well-known Christian greeting. It says "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." It also tells us to "Greet each other with a holy kiss" but this passage seems outdated in the Covid era. In general, how we greet each other says a great deal about who we are as a people of God and how we see "others."

How do we, as a country, greet new immigrants, refugees and asylum seekers? In the first reading Moses says "This is indeed a stiff-necked people; yet pardon our wickedness and sins and receive us as your own." Perhaps when we act and react from fear or misunderstanding we are much like the stiff-necked, wicked Israelites, but our nation's ideals are noble. Consider our iconic Statue of Liberty that welcomes people to Ellis Island in New York's harbor. It has a poem by Emma Lazarus on its base entitled "The New Colossus" which reads, in part...

Give me your tired, your poor, Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free... Send these, the homeless, tempest tossed to me, I lift my lamp beside the golden door!

This greeting to newcomers on one of America's greatest symbols is a clarion call to walk in solidarity with refugees on their journeys. Catholic social teachings remind us "solidarity must follow charity." The next step involves entering into relationships. Bonding with people on the margins of society and standing in union with them helps all those involved become both "lights for the world" and beacons of hope. These lights symbolize welcome and a greeting as does the torch on the Statue of Liberty!

We see God in all our sisters and brothers, but particularly in our refugee and immigrant friends. They are both our companions and sojourners on the road of life. Please consider joining the Immigrant and Refugee Ministry at Old St Pat's. Accompany us so we can accompany others on their paths to new starts and a new country - a country that still welcomes immigrants.







Blessed Angelina of Marsciano

Saint of the Day for June 4, 2023

Blessed Angeline founded the first community of Franciscan women other than Poor Clares to receive papal approval.

Angeline was born to the Duke of Marsciano near Orvieto. She was 12 when her mother died. Three years later, the young woman made a vow of perpetual chastity. That same year, however, she yielded to her father's decision that she marry the Duke of Civitella. Her husband agreed to respect her previous vow.

When he died two years later, Angeline joined the Secular Franciscans and with several other women dedicated herself to caring for the sick, the poor, widows and orphans. When many other young women were attracted to Angeline's community, some people accused her of condemning the married vocation. Legend has it that when she came before the King of Naples to answer these charges, she had burning coals hidden in the folds of her cloak. When she proclaimed her innocence and showed the king that these coals had not harmed her, he dropped the case.

Angeline and her companions later went to Foligno, where her community of Third Order sisters received papal approval in 1397. She soon established 15 similar communities of women in other Italian cities.

Angeline died on July 14, 1435, and was beatified in 1825. Her liturgical feast is celebrated on July 13.

Priests, sisters and brothers cannot be signs of God's love for the human family if they belittle the vocation of marriage. Angeline respected marriage, but felt called to another way of living out the gospel. Her choice was life-giving in its own way.
