

## WHAT GOOD HAPPENS IN NORTH LAWNDALE? By: Michael Trout



OSP members and the YMEN Host at My Brother's Kitchen

Assumptions can be very dangerous! During the time of Jesus, the people could hardly imagine that the Messiah – the hope of the world – would come out of a town like Nazareth. People assumed that truly "good things" come out of places of resource, influence, and power. Nazareth was not the center of business or politics or education .... leading Nathanael to ask, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" The disciple, Philip, responded with an invitation to bear witness, "Come and see!". Indeed, it was to this simple and humble region that the GOOD NEWS and the salvation of the world came forth. The followers of Jesus who overcame their initial assumptions, got a front row seat to seeing God's goodness in action!

Over 30 years ago, I moved into North Lawndale on Chicago's West Side. Many asked why a recent graduate from Wheaton College would plant their roots in a neighborhood some deemed as "blighted." The answer is that there were many beautiful things happening in North Lawndale and I wanted a front row seat to what God was doing in this community that others deemed "the home of the permanent underclass."

For three decades, I have witnessed a resilient, kind, creative, passionate neighborhood of African Americans fighting against a world of injustice and inequity only to emerge as a place that I call, my Beloved Community. This Beloved Community also includes many members at Old St Pats Church (OSP) that have formed the bonds of kinship and are walking with us as we seek the Shalom of the kingdom of God. Each month, a group from OSP comes to My Brothers Kitchen at the Young Men's Educational Network where a brunch is served and received by 150-200 community members. Some have said that this meal with our OSP friends is one of their favorite weekly highlights. If you have not visited North Lawndale or perhaps you have made some assumptions about the neighborhood, I would invite you to come with OSP's My Brother's Kitchen volunteers to experience what God is doing.

Can anything good come from North Lawndale? Yes. Come and see for yourself.





## Our Lady of Lourdes Saint of the Day for February 11, 2024

On December 8, 1854, Pope Pius IX proclaimed the dogma of the Immaculate Conception in the apostolic constitution Ineffabilis Deus. A little more than three years later, on February 11, 1858, a young lady appeared to Bernadette Soubirous. This began a series of visions. During the apparition on March 25, the lady identified herself with the words: "I am the Immaculate Conception."

Bernadette was a sickly child of poor parents. Their practice of the Catholic faith was scarcely more than lukewarm. Bernadette could pray the Our Father, the Hail Mary and the Creed. She also knew the prayer of the Miraculous Medal: "O Mary conceived without sin."

During interrogations Bernadette gave an account of what she saw. It was "something white in the shape of a girl" She used the word aquero, a dialect term meaning "this thing." It was "a pretty young girl with a rosary over her arm." Her white robe was encircled by a blue girdle. She wore a white veil. There was a yellow rose on each foot. A rosary was in her hand. Bernadette was also impressed by the fact that the lady did not use the informal form of address (tu), but the polite form (vous). The humble virgin appeared to a humble girl and treated her with dignity.

Through that humble girl, Mary revitalized and continues to revitalize the faith of millions of people. People began to flock to Lourdes from other parts of France and from all over the world. In 1862 Church authorities confirmed the authenticity of the apparitions and authorized the cult of Our Lady of Lourdes for the diocese. The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes became worldwide in 1907.

Lourdes has become a place of pilgrimage and healing, but even more of faith. Church authorities have recognized over 60 miraculous cures, although there have probably been many more. To people of faith this is not surprising. It is a continuation of Jesus' healing miracles—now performed at the intercession of his mother. Some would say that the greater miracles are hidden. Many who visit Lourdes return home with renewed faith and a readiness to serve God in their needy brothers and sisters.

There still may be people who doubt the apparitions of Lourdes. Perhaps the best that can be said to them are the words that introduce the film The Song of Bernadette: "For those who believe in God, no explanation is necessary. For those who do not believe, no explanation is possible."


