GREEN NOTES FROM OSP GREEN TEAM: CELEBRATE EARTH DAY AND BE INSPIRED BY ONE EARTH FILM FESTIVAL

The first Earth Day was celebrated on April 22, 1970. Senator Gaylord Nelson from Wisconsin and others advocated for a day in early spring when people everywhere could take time to educate themselves about environmental issues, and advocate for changes that would produce a more sustainable world. About 20 million people participated in the first Earth Day. They attended educational events at schools and colleges; volunteered to collect trash at local parks, forests, rivers, and beaches; participated in tree plantings and other events; and advocated for environmental legislation. Those efforts bore fruit, as the 1970's saw the passage of several important environmental bills, including the Clean Air and Clean Water Act; and the establishment of the Environmental Protection Agency.

In 2024, 54 years after the first Earth Day, Earth Day continues to be celebrated across the world, with one billion people in 193 countries expected to join in. The theme for 2024's Earth Day is "Planet vs. Plastic," calling attention to the effects of single use plastics on our world. The health of our world and ourselves depends on reduction in their use. Microplastics have emerged in recent years as a significant threat, especially to children living in the global South.

Your local forest preserve, park, or nature center likely has activities planned around Earth Day. And you can visit the earthday.org website for an interactive global map showing Earth Day events.

From its beginnings in 2012, the One Earth Film Festival has grown into the Midwest's premier showcase for environmental films. This year the One Earth Film Festival takes place from April 17 to April 23, spanning Earth Day. In 2024, the festival includes five days of live screenings, and two days of virtual events. Showings take place at multiple locations, including the city itself and its suburbs. Venues include local churches, libraries, theatres, and the Peggy Notebart Nature Museum. Tickets are generally free, with an \$8 suggested donation.

The movies featured in this year's festival cover vital issues like regenerative agriculture, rain forest protection, gentrification, young filmmakers' voices, ecofeminism, and water justice. In "Wings of Dust," learn about a Peruvian Indigenous journalist who risks his life so his son can have a future with clean water. "A Good Neighbor" tells the story of a Latina single mother who campaigns for city council in one of our country's most polluted zip codes. The film "Common Ground" demonstrates the power of regenerative agriculture to heal our soils, our lives, and the world's ecosystems. 



Hi everyone. It's Mike Nykaza. My mom, Marge Nykaza, was a long-time parishioner at Old St. Pat's, and she had a heart for the hurting. She also loved music. So a few years ago, she started a nonprofit called Harmony, Hope & Healing. HHH's mission is to heal individuals and families through the healing power of music. Each year, HHH serves over 800 individuals and hosts over 200 classes in the Chicagoland area. In August of last year, my mom passed away at the young age of 69. Now, HHH is in need of our help.

To keep Mom's dream alive, we have initiated an emergency fundraising campaign. Our goal is to raise \$75,000 in the next three months, so we can continue to provide solace to vulnerable individuals in our city. The Numbers

The City of Chicago recently released some statistics regarding the migrant crisis that has evolved "since August 2022, and as of January 3, 2024." These numbers are not meant to be accurate to the last decimal, or as of yesterday, but they give us an idea of the scope of the crisis that emerged since the governor of Texas started putting migrants on buses and directing the drivers to take them to Chicago. Here is the data that was provided:

- Chicago has welcomed over 38,400 migrants
- 33,739 arrived in the Chicago "landing zone"; 4,702 arrived at O'Hare & Midway
- 865 buses arrived in Chicago
- 21 shelters in operation
- 14,681 staying in shelters as of 1/3/2024

The IRM at Work

To date, OSP's Immigrant and Refugee Ministry (IRM) committee has worked with 6 Venezuelan families, settling them in apartments which we furnished through the Chicago Furniture Bank, and filling their cupboards and refrigerators with food. Due to the generosity of the members of OSP, we are able to pay their rent for the first 6 months.

We are actively working to find employment for our families. Some are working at construction and home improvement work, but that work is not always consistent. We have collected work histories for each father who is looking for a job, and pursuing whatever leads we can, providing translation as needed.

The Archdiocese at Work

The good news is that more than 15 additional parishes in the diocese are now engaged in this ministry. Furthermore, it was announced earlier this month that St. Bartholomew School, on the northwest side was soon to be opened as a shelter. And our Catholic Charities office has been in partnership with OSP in this work.



Life Goes On

On April 7, OSP/IRM member, Anne Durkin, hosted a baby shower for one of our moms, Yeiliani Avila, who is expecting a baby boy. Anne's living room overflowed with gifts provided by IRM members. The family was so grateful.



Two Gentlemen from Venezuela (Not Verona)

IRM member, Ann Harsy, introduced us to Juan and Wilfredo. Juan has been challenged with serious health problems that have kept him hospitalized for some time. Wilfredo has been his guardian angel. They connected us to the Romero family who found an apartment in Waukegan. IRM member, Terry Scully, rounded up some volunteers and some of the household goods IRM has collected. As you see in the photo he shared, beds were being made by OSP member, Peg Roth, assisted by Geraldina Ochoa, from St. Mary of the Lake parish.

Saint Anselm

Saint of the Day for April 21, 2024

Indifferent toward religion as a young man, Anselm became one of the Church's greatest theologians and leaders. He received the title "Father of Scholasticism" for his attempt to analyze and illumine the truths of faith through the aid of reason.

At 15, Anselm wanted to enter a monastery, but was refused acceptance because of his father's opposition. Twelve years later, after careless disinterest in religion and years of worldly living, he finally fulfilled his desire to be a monk. He entered the monastery of Bec in Normandy, was elected prior three years later, and 15 years later, was unanimously chosen abbot.

Considered an original and independent thinker, Anselm was admired for his patience, gentleness, and teaching skill. Under his leadership, the Abbey of Bec became a monastic school, influential in philosophical and theological studies.

During these years, at the community's request, Anselm began publishing his theological works, comparable to those of Saint Augustine. His best-known work is the book Cur Deus Homo ("Why God Became Man").

Against his will, Anselm was appointed archbishop of Canterbury in 1093, at age 60. His appointment was opposed at first by England's King William Rufus and later accepted. Rufus persistently refused to cooperate with efforts to reform the Church.

Anselm finally went into voluntary exile until Rufus died in 1100. He was then recalled to England by Rufus' brother and successor, Henry I. Disagreeing fearlessly with Henry over the king's insistence on investing England's bishops, Anselm spent another three years in exile in Rome.

His care and concern extended to the very poorest people. Opposing the slave trade, Anselm obtained from the national council at Westminster the passage of a resolution prohibiting the sale of human beings.

Like every true follower of Christ, Anselm had to carry his cross, especially in the form of opposition and conflict with those in political control. Though personally a mild and gentle man and a lover of peace, he would not back off from conflict and persecution when principles were at stake.

Sunday Parking:


